The U.S. Department of Labor<sup>1</sup> projects the employment of diagnostic medical sonographers will grow 17 percent from 2016 to 2026, much faster than the average for all occupations. As imaging technology evolves, medical facilities will continue to use ultrasound to replace more invasive and costly procedures. Third-party payers also encourage the use of these noninvasive measures over invasive ones to reduce cost. In addition, as the large baby-boom population ages, the need to diagnose medical conditions—such as blood clots and heart disease—will likely increase.
