## **GRADUATE COMPETENCIES**

## BASED ON THE 2012 STATEWIDE STANDARDIZED CURRICULUM

Upon completion of this program the graduate will be able to:

- 1. Explain the structure and function of each system and the relationship that exists between the systems.
- 2. Explain the role of the practical nurse and understand the Mississippi Board of Nursing's administrative code as it relates to the practical nurse.
- 3. Develop a safe and effective care environment for client care and health-care personnel.
- 4. Relate the impact of growth and development in the care of clients and families.
- 5. Promote and support the emotional, mental, and social well-being of clients.
- 6. Discuss basic nutritional requirements and relate them to health promotion and maintenance.
- 7. Perform nursing skills with the appropriate nursing considerations that promote the physical health and well-being of clients based on scientific principles and the required technical skills.
- 8. Recognize safe effective client care related to the administration of medications.
- 9. Explain diagnostic tests and procedures with the appropriate nursing considerations.
- 10. Discuss classifications of drugs with the expected outcomes, contraindications, drug interactions, and nursing interventions.
- 11. Summarize the major legal implications of medication administration and IV therapy.
- 12. Perform calculations needed for medication/IV administration.
- 13. Administer medications by various routes.
- 14. Discuss and demonstrate nursing responsibilities in preparation for and during venipuncture for blood collection and IV access to include identifying and locating peripheral veins.
- 15. Initiate, monitor, regulate, and maintain client IV sites and flow rates in the clinical/lab setting.
- 16. Promote the prevention and/or early detection of health problems.
- 17. Promote safe and effective care for the client experiencing acute, chronic, or life threatening physical health conditions.
- 18. Promote and support the emotional, mental, and social well-being of clients experiencing acute, chronic, or life-threatening physical health conditions.
- 19. Utilize the nursing process to provide safe and effective care for adult clients experiencing acute, chronic, or life-threatening physical health conditions.
- 20. Perform client care in the clinical setting.
- 21. Promote safe and effective care for clients and families during antepartum, intrapartum, and postpartum periods.
- 22. Promote safe and effective care for clients and families from infancy through adolescence.
- 23. Promote the safety and well-being of a client and family with a mental health alteration.
- 24. Perform the nursing care and treatment modalities for various alterations in mental health.
- 25. Transition from student to the role of an entry-level Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN).
- 26. Understand the ethical and legal aspects of nursing practice and licensure.
- 27. Prepare for the National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX-PN®).
- 28. Demonstrate the role of an entry level LPN in a clinical setting.
