## Lane Regional Medical Center Named 2013 Hospital of the Year

Lane Regional Medical Center was named "2013 Acute Care Hospital of the Year" (61-160 beds) at the 12th Annual Nightingale Awards held on February 16, 2013 at the Crowne Plaza Hotel in Baton Rouge. This is the first time the hospital has received this award.

The annual Nightingale Awards are sponsored by the Louisiana Nurses Foundation and the Louisiana State Nurses Association to recognize excellence in nursing and quality service in the nursing and healthcare industry. The Nightingale Award for Acute Care Hospital of the Year is based on five criteria:

- innovation through nursing leadership and management
- organizational support of nursing practice
- evidence of registered nurse decision making and participation in management decisions
- recognition of registered nurse achievements
- support of nursing participation in professional organizations.



## **Radiation Oncology Services Coming to Lane**

Lane Regional Medical Center and Baton Rouge General recently announced a joint venture to bring lifesaving Radiation Oncology services to Zachary.

Those battling cancer will no longer have to travel elsewhere to receive this much needed treatment, because there will be a nationally recognized cancer program on Lane's campus that will benefit cancer patients for years to come.


Radiation oncology is defined as the use of high energy radiation to control, shrink or kill cancerous cells, and is often used as a curative or controlling treatment, usually in combination with surgery and/or chemotherapy. The American Cancer Society estimates about 23,480 new cancer diagnoses in Louisiana this year, with prostate, lung, female breast, and colo-rectal among the most common. About 50% of all cancer patients receive some type of radiation therapy during the course of their treatment.

Radiation Oncology services are expected to begin at Lane in January 2014.

## Nurses Hold Evidence Based Practice Expo

Nurses throughout Lane have actively engaged in evidence-based practice projects resulting in changed protocols, improved patient care, and positively affected patient outcomes. Lane is Louisiana's first Pathway to Excellence facility.





## New Coronary Artery Diagnostic System

Lane Regional Medical Center is the first and only hospital in the region to use St. Jude Medical's ILUMIEN PCI Optimization System for patients with coronary artery disease.

Patients with coronary artery disease experience decreased oxygen delivery to the heart due to plaque or cholesterol build-up inside arteries.

The key to optimizing treatment of coronary artery disease is knowing which blockage needs treatment and how to treat it," said Dr. Deepak Thekkoott. "The ILUMIEN system allows physicians to identify the precise measurements and dimensions of narrowed arteries responsible for obstructing blood flow to the patient's heart." The ILUMIEN system combines optical coherence tomography (OCT) and fractional flow reserve (FFR) technologies on one platform:

• OCT technology is used to visualize and measure important vessel characteristics that are used in guiding stent selection and deployment and also provides post-stenting information to ensure the procedure was successful.

• FFR technology is used to determine the severity of blood flow blockages in coronary arteries to better identify specific narrowings.



## Lane's Prescription Discount Program

### What is Lane's Prescription Discount Program?

Lane Regional Medical Center is qualified to participate in the federal government's 340B program that helps uninsured patients receive discounted prescription drugs. Uninsured patients may receive a significantly discounted cost on their medications. Patients with prescription coverage will pay their co-pay as they do today yet are still able to save on medications not covered by their plan, all while helping families who are less fortunate.

#### How can I participate in Lane's Prescription Discount Program?

If you are a patient of Lane Behavioral Health Services, Lane Family Practice & Sports Medicine, Lane Surgery Group or Zachary Family Practice, you will receive a Lane Prescription Discount Card after your visit with the physician.

You will also receive the card when you are admitted into Lane Regional Medical Center for care or are admitted as a patient in the Emergency Room, Day Surgery Center, Endoscopy/Infusion Center, Cardiovascular Center, or Wound Care/Hyperbaric Center.
