ATPI Alerts Travel Restrictions per Country due to Coronavirus (COVID-19)

Dear Valued Client,

Countries all over the world are implementing travel bans and restrictions in an effort to limit the spread of the COVID pandemic outbreak. Below you may find the most recent updates in short. Note that unexpected travel cancellations are taking place and airlines status may change at any given time without prior notice. The enlisted information are based on the officially announced governmental travel restrictions and quarantine measures.

Below is a summary of the latest updates, please be aware it is not a complete overview of all current travel bans and restrictions.

Areas & airports opening or softening restrictions

EUROPEAN COUNTRIES:

1. **Italy:** Update: Rome's Ciampino Airport, Florence's Peretola Airport to reopen from 4 May as COVID-19 lockdown eases
2. **Liechtenstein, Switzerland:** Security Message: U.S. Embassy reports on plan to ease COVID-19 measures
3. **U.K.: Update: British Airways** changes its cancellations policy for all travel through 31 July
4. **France, Africa:** Update: Air France plans to resume most of its flights to Africa from 3 July, some destinations will be served earlier
5. **Italy, Netherlands: Update: KLM** to resume flights to, from Milan on 4 May after COVID-19 route suspension
6. **Belgium, France, U.K.: Eurostar** announces passengers must wear face masks from 4 May to halt spread of COVID-19
7. **France:** Update: Authorities announce passengers on public transport must wear face masks from 11 May to halt COVID-19 spread

ASIAN/AUSTRALIAN COUNTRIES:

8. **Taiwan:** Security Message: American Institute in Taiwan reports no new cases of COVID-19, updates, reissues information on travel restrictions
9. **Australia:** Security Message: U.S. Consulate reports New South Wales and Northern Territory are relaxing social distancing rules amid COVID-19 concerns
10. **New Zealand:** Update: Some public transport services resume in Wellington after easing of COVID-19 travel restrictions

LATIN AMERICAN COUNTRIES:

11. **Mexico:** Update: Viva Aerobus to gradually resume flights to Cancun airport from mid-May amid COVID-19 pandemic

NORTH AMERICAN COUNTRIES:

12. **U.S.:** Update: Hawaiian Airlines announces passengers must wear face masks from 8 May to halt COVID-19 spread
13. **U.S.:** Update: American, Delta and United Airlines to require passengers wear face masks from 4 May to halt COVID-19 spread

AFRICAN / MIDDLE EAST COUNTRIES:

14. **Rwanda:** Update: Government to ease COVID-19 restrictions from 4 May
15. **Bangladesh:** Update: Civil Aviation Authority plans to resume domestic flights from 8 May if COVID-19 situation improves
16. **Africa, France:** Update: Air France plans to resume most of its flights to Africa from 3 July, some destinations will be served earlier
17. **Namibia:** Update: Air Namibia resumes domestic flights from 6 May amid COVID-19 pandemic
18. **Jordan:** Update: Government lifts all restrictions on economic activity in latest easing of COVID-19 lockdown rules

Areas & airports imposing further restrictions

1. **Japan:** Update: Prime minister extends COVID-19 state of emergency by about one month
2. **Azerbaijan:** Update: Partial COVID-19 lockdown extended until 31 May
3. **India:** Update: Government to extend nationwide COVID-19 lockdown by another two weeks, will ease restrictions in lower-risk districts
4. **Zimbabwe:** Update: President extends COVID-19 lockdown by another two weeks
5. **Djibouti:** Security Message: U.S. Embassy reports lockdown will continue at least until 8 May; flights remain suspended amid COVID-19 concerns
6. **Panama:** Security Message: U.S. Embassy reports increased movement restrictions on 2, 3 May because of COVID-19
7. **Zimbabwe:** Update: President extends COVID-19 lockdown by another two weeks
8. **Sierra Leone:** Security Message: U.S. Embassy reports nationwide lockdown set for 3-5 May because of COVID-19

9. **Rwanda:** Security Message: U.S. Embassy reports updated COVID-19 prevention measures effective 4 May
10. **Ireland:** Update: COVID-19 lockdown extended to 18 May
11. **Nigeria:** Security Message: U.S. Embassy and Consulate report COVID-19 lockdown reminders
12. **Ghana:** Security Message: U.S. Embassy reports border closure extended until 31 May, reissues other COVID-19 travel concerns
13. **India:** Update: Railways extends suspension of all passenger trains until 17 May amid COVID-19 lockdown
14. **India:** Update: Suspension of all domestic, international flights extended until 17 May amid COVID-19 pandemic
15. **U.K.:** Update: London's Heathrow Airport will temporarily suspend operations in Terminal 4 from 3 May because of COVID-19
16. **Spain:** Update: Government announces face masks will be compulsory on public transport from 4 May to halt spread of COVID-19
17. **Philippines:** Government closes all airports to Filipino returnees because of COVID-19 quarantine overload
18. **Sri Lanka:** Update: Curfew in parts of Colombo extended until 11 May
19. **India:** Update: Delhi's Indira Gandhi International Airport will operate commercial passenger flights from Terminal 3 after lockdown ends

AIRLINES:

20. **Asia:** Update: Jetstar Asia extends suspension of its flights until 31 May amid COVID-19 pandemic; repatriation flights to continue
21. **China, Russia:** China Airlines to require passengers traveling from Moscow to Beijing to have negative COVID-19 test in order to board from 8 May
22. **Italy, U.S.:** Alitalia suspends its flights between Rome and New York from 5 until 31 May amid COVID-19 pandemic
