# Managing and Recovering Together



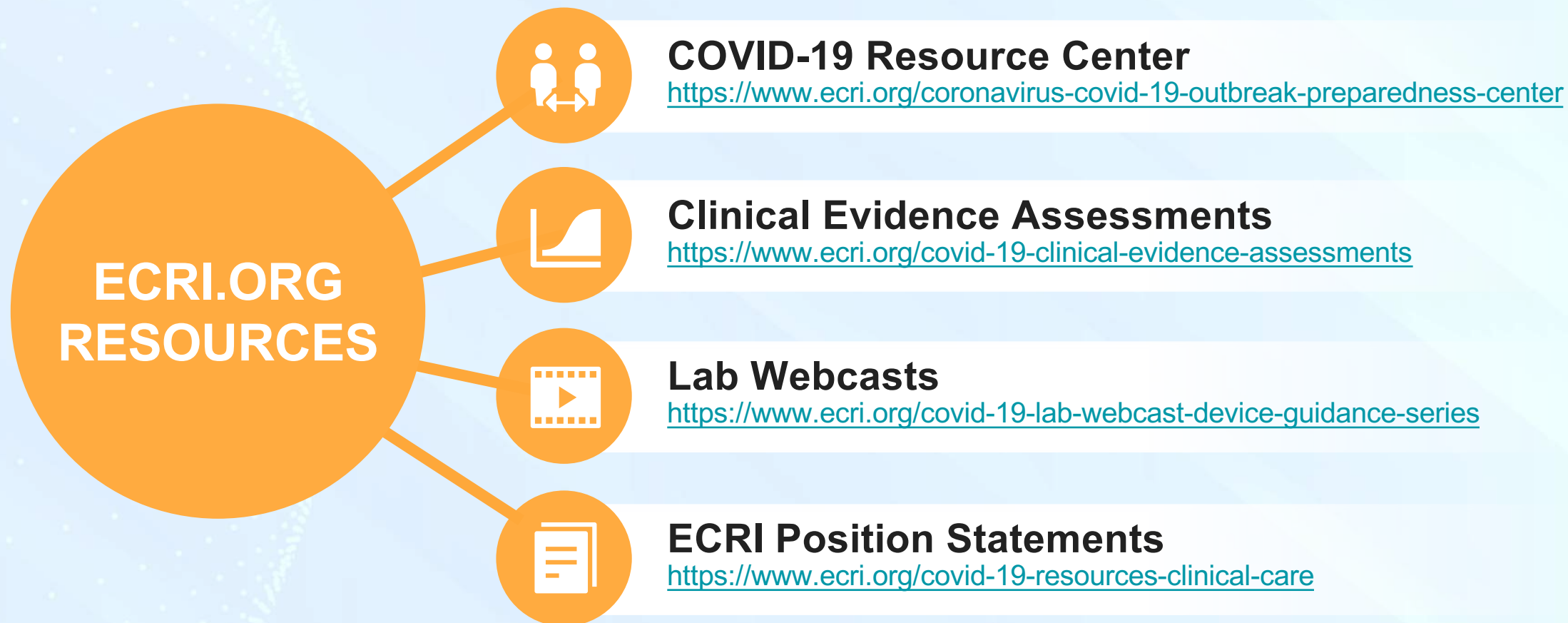
## WHAT WE KNOW
