Student Help Day Tuesday, January 8

Students are <u>required</u> to come in upon teachers' request, or they can come in and see a teacher(s) if they desire extra help. Students who need to see more than 1 teacher should arrive early. **Attendance will be taken in Skyward**. Co-curricular activities will not begin until 12:15.

Students are not to congregate in the hallways as this is a disturbance for other students. Once students have seen the teacher(s) they need to, they should exit the building. Students will be allowed to wear sweatpants and casual wear.

Final Exam Exemption Policy & Schedule January 9, 10 & 11

All students are expected to be present for semester exam periods unless:

- An elective course has a project-based exam with the opportunity to finish ahead of exam day (including but not limited to: Art, FACE, Industrial Arts classes). In this case, the teacher must make it clear to students that the period should be treated as a study hall-they can either be in the IMC or not in the building at all.
- An AP course teacher allows students who have taken the AP exam to use that as their final.

- <u>Senior Exemptions</u>-ALL of the following must apply for a senior to be exempt from an exam
 - Cumulative 3.0 GPA or higher (list attached)
 - A- (90.00%) or higher in the class (AP classes should be treated the exact same way-an A- is an A- and a 90% is a 90%--weight of class does not apply to exemptions)
 - Teacher Approval for Exemption

<u>Semester Classes</u>: Seniors in one semester classes will be eligible for a final exam exemption at the end of the semester (1st or 2nd).

<u>Full Year Classes</u>: Seniors in full year classes will be eligible for a final exam exemption 2nd semester only.
