# PREPARING FOR COLLEGE: SOPHOMORE YEAR CHECKLIST

## JULY-AUGUST (Summer going into Sophomore year)

- **Reflect** on your academic performance from your freshman year. Are you happy with the grades you earned? Do you need to put forth more effort during this upcoming year?
- **Assess** your course selection for 10th grade. Do you anticipate your classes being both challenging and realistic? How do they relate to your abilities and interests? Feel free to connect with Mrs. Hammerling about classes over the summer through email.
- Summer is a time to explore new activities and expand horizons. Consider volunteering, traveling or even finding a job. You could gain insight, discover a passion or simply have some extra cash in your pocket. Start developing a personal savings plan. Mrs. Herbig's Personal Finance course is perfect to take if you need help understanding how to do this.
- It's a good time to learn and/or test strategies for time management. Try to carve out a schedule that includes a balance between work, play and rest. See if you can sneak in some time to start exploring your post-high school options.
- Explore Naviance! If you haven't already, complete the Career Interest Profiler. Identify three careers that match you. Add them to your list. Naviance-Go to <u>www.martinlutherhs.org</u> and Naviance is under Quicklinks
- **Track** your volunteer hours, achievements, employment opportunities, and references in the resume section of Naviance. This helps prepare for applying to college your senior year.

### SEPTEMBER-DECEMBER

- Make sure you have a meeting with Mrs. Hammerling (she will schedule it with you) to review classes and academic plan through senior year. You will also discuss sophomore expectations and becoming acclimated.
- Consider getting involved in a school club or community group that interests you. This will lead to richer life experiences and a well-rounded college application. Be sure to keep your personal file updated with your participation and achievements in Naviance.
- Participate in ML's **Career Day**.

### JANUARY-MARCH

- Explore career website: <u>www.bls.gov</u> Bureau of Labor Statistics-Occupational Outlook Handbook.
- Naviance (<u>www.martinlutherhs.org</u> then Quick links) lesson plan will be completed with Mrs. Hammerling that focuses on career exploration and development.

#### MAY-JUNE

- Review college application checklist (see attached)
