WHAT INSPIRED YOU TO WORK WITH THE AGING POPULATION?

The developed world is aging from Japan to Europe to the United States. Diseases like Alzheimer's, heart disease and cancer are consuming more and more resources. We need to develop solutions for these problems that are practical and affordable for the aging population.

WHO IS YOUR HEALTHCARE HERO?

Francis Collins. A physician-geneticist, he was known for his landmark discoveries of disease genes and leadership of the Human Genome Project, the first mapping of human DNA. This is one of the greatest accomplishments in human history, although the full healthcare benefit of that project is still being played out. Dr. Collins also wrote an amazing book called the "Language of God" that beautifully laid out the relationship between modern science and religion and how they can coexist. I also admire the home care workers across the country that help take care of the senior population in their homes. They are often forgotten and unappreciated but are a critical part of our healthcare system.

WHAT INSPIRED YOU TO WORK WITH THE AGING POPULATION?

Like many in the space, I was inspired to work with the aging population by my parents. I lost my father when he was 87 after a protracted battle with cancer, and my 90-year-old mother lives over 3,000 miles away and still drives. I want to make a difference in both the lives of older adults and the family caregivers that support them.

Chronic pain affects 100 million Americans at an annual cost of \$600 billion. Led by President, CEO and Director Shai N. Gozani, M.D., PH.D., NeuroMetrix has roots in the labs of MIT and is applying neurotechnology to address the chronic pain epidemic with a drug-free, wearable technology solution called Quell. Quell was designed to meet the needs of people with conditions like arthritis, back pain, leg pain and nerve pain who wish to manage their pain without side effects. The FDA-cleared device works by stimulating the sensory nerves in the upper calf, which carry neural pulses to the brain. This stimulation triggers the release of the body's natural pain blockers to deliver widespread relief in your body. Paired with the Quell app, users can optimize therapy and track progress, including eight dimensions of sleep, activity and pain levels.

There are far too many "cool technologies" chasing problems. Most wearable devices target the worried well but don't address the major societal challenges. Technology can not only address costs but dramatically improve quality of life.



JEAN ANNE BOOTH UNALIWEAR

UnaliWear's mission is to extend independence with dignity for millions of vulnerable seniors with its Kanega watch product. CEO and Founder Jean Anne Booth came out of retirement to create a product that her independent, yet aging mother could wear with pride and dignity. The Kanega watch offers medication reminders, fall detection, wanderguard and automatic emergency help, even when a senior cannot ask for it. It is a dignified, discreet product, which requires no programming or smart phone or app. It is a stylish, innovative product that addresses many of the primary issues our aging population faces today, allowing them to live independently with an appropriate safety and monitoring device that is simple in concept, yet very complex in what it delivers.

Alejandro Badia, M.D., FACS, is a hand and upper extremity surgeon at Badia Hand to Shoulder Center in Miami. The free CareSync app (web and native iOS and Android app) tracks appointments, tasks, medications, medical data and more, and it syncs with devices such as blood pressure and glucose monitors. It has been named a Top 10 Drug App by the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences College of Pharmacy. And CareSync was awarded Technology Company of the Year 2016 by Tampa Bay Technology Forum. CareSync lessens the burden on patients and their caregivers and helps patients avoid unnecessary, expensive tests, ER visits and hospital stays. It has identified and removed major medical errors in patient records and helped patients avoid serious reactions from the wrong combination of medicines.

This product is in human testing today and ready for commercialization in 2017.

WHO IS YOUR HEALTHCARE HERO?

My dad, Dr. Ditmar Kaul. He was a psychiatrist who practiced in Calgary, Alberta, and he taught me everything I know about caring for other people. He was a shining star in the Canadian medical community and when he died unexpectedly at the age of 59, nearly 1,000 people came to pay their respects at his memorial service. The work we do at Cloud DX is dedicated, in part, to his memory.

WHAT INSPIRED YOU TO WORK WITH THE AGING POPULATION?

At Cloud DX, we believe consumers deserve better tools to track their health status in real time. Doctors and nurses also deserve sophisticated equipment to care for their patients. To help solve this problem, we've engineered our devices to provide clinical accurate readings. We want our users to feel empowered and help revolutionize wellness education. It's time to start taking control and managing your own health.



VIVEK GARIPALLI CLOVER HEALTH

Clover Health's goal is to improve the quality of life of its members and physicians, and it starts with its insurance model. Clover aligns with physicians by reducing friction and increasing transparency, leading to improved patient care. Notably, it sells plans to seniors on Medicare Advantage. Its technology is designed to take data from labs, claims and other factors to identify patients at risk for hospitalization and intervene earlier. It also seeks to improve care coordination. Its physicians can focus on people, not paperwork. The Clover team also works to serve as partners in care, using patient-centered analytics and a dedicated care management team to identify potential risks and directly provide preventive care. CEO Vivek Garipalli is a co-founder and board member.

WHO IS YOUR HEALTHCARE HERO?

Everyone who devotes their lives to being on the front lines helping patients.

WHAT INSPIRED YOU TO WORK WITH THE AGING POPULATION?

One of the stark realities I encountered in the hospital business was the basic inequality of insurance coverage, and for a lot of people, a lack thereof. Many of the hospital closures I saw were in areas where the low-income population was a high percentage of patient volume.

Investing in the social, economic and access issues that are barriers to improving clinical outcomes is the key to building a company that can make a dramatic impact in healthcare—especially among people over the age of 65, who often deal with multiple co-morbidities and struggle to make ends meet on a fixed income.

We did not get into health insurance because we wanted to build a better health insurance company—we got into health insurance, and specifically Medicare Advantage, because it holds all the levers and financial alignment necessary to improve health outcomes for an aging population.



PRAB GORIPARTHI DOSECAST 360

A major problem in healthcare is keeping patients on track with complex medication regimens. Montuno Software invented Dosecast, a mobile app that engages patients to adhere to prescriptions and provides adherence information to caregivers. To enhance its usefulness, Montuno is partnering with Radish Systems to offer Dosecast 360 "powered by ChoiceView®" to healthcare organizations. The Dosecast 360 app further supports adherence with "voice-with-visuals telecare" communications between patients and caregivers. Patients can talk/text while seeing graphics and photos sent by their healthcare providers to communicate about their condition and medications. Many patients, especially those with difficulty hearing or comprehending English, can use the Dosecast 360 app on their mobile devices to support their healthcare. With Dosecast, patients can regain/retain their health while keeping their caregivers in the loop; health plans can improve member health while serving providers and reducing costs; healthcare providers can improve patient health while seeing patient behavior; and pharma firms can improve treatment outcomes by better understanding patient behavior. DR. BLAINE WARKENTINE CAREGOALS ACP

Dr. Blaine Warkentine, MPH, is tackling a tremendously large issue for seniors by giving healthcare providers a tool to improve the value of discussions for advance care planning (ACP). He is CEO of Caregoals ACP, which brings not just a good fee-for-service solution to the table but leverages these discussions toward value-based healthcare improvement by giving patients and their families an appropriate perspective on how they should be preparing for aging and end-of-life care well ahead of time. Starting preparation early is critical to better experiences, as many resources are wasted on unwanted care in the last month of life alone.

WHO IS YOUR HEALTHCARE HERO?

Any family able to sit down and talk to one another about death, early and often. Families and loved ones who work hard to make their aging years special and valuable. Ones who work to help the next generation better understand how to maximize their lives in the process.

WHAT INSPIRED YOU TO WORK WITH THE AGING POPULATION?

I discovered with my late grand mom that a large chunk of healthcare is happy with ignoring the aging process until chronic disease takes over. It was clear that reimbursements for hospital stays were 100 times more profitable than keeping her healthy at home. I am a medical doctor and have a degree in population health and became irritated with the way the world, but especially the U.S., deals with medical decision making for aging improvement and end of life care.

All of this could change simply with an open dialogue that could bring more joy not just to the final days but to all days in between. I decided I would attempt to reinvent the advance directive and make it video- and audio-based engagement. I have spent resources to build intellectual property around that idea and commercialize products. Vimty.com was meant to be a B2C tool and, more recently, Caregoals.com is a for telemedicine environments and primary care clinics for advance care planning reimbursements.

I believe that to improve aging we must first do a better job of listening to one another. Our values, beliefs and preferences matter. From there, we can personalize care in ways that are far more valuable. Lastly, I think the only way to make this effort sustainable is to build a marketplace of aging improvement that can be fully embraced by the communities in which we live.



BRONWYN SPIRA FORCE THERAPEUTICS

Force Therapeutics is changing the way people recover from total joint replacement surgery by delivering video-based exercises and education prescribed by their surgeon and care team. Force is a digital health business that works with health systems to monitor and track patients through a clinically proven web platform. It offers remote monitoring and telemedicine to physical therapy, making it easier for people to recuperate from home after surgical procedures and still follow through on their physical therapy regimen. Patients do better when they are connected, knowledgeable and know someone is looking out for them. Through using Force, our clients have seen greater than 80 percent engagement rates throughout an episode and a greater than 20 percent improvement in patient satisfaction. Force Therapeutics is led by CEO and Co-founder Bronwyn Spira.

WHO IS YOUR HEALTHCARE HERO?

WHAT INSPIRED YOU TO WORK WITH THE AGING POPULATION?

I worked with this population as a clinician for years and established a deep understanding of their specific challenges with respect to recovery and access to care. This population inspired me to create Force Therapeutics, a web and mobile recovery platform that uses video-based education and information to deliver prescriptive care plans to patients where they are most comfortable, their home. The 50+ population is often dismissed as being technology-phobic or unsophisticated in that regard. We have found the opposite and continue to develop and design our technology to cater to this group.



JOSH BRUNO HOMETEAM

Hometeam's mission is to make every day for an older adult a day they want to live. The company steps in after a serious medical incident and helps solve a series of problems. Hometeam begins with helping individuals map out their recovery from a serious incident. This includes getting their families up to speed and helping coordinate among loved ones through a team of specially trained advisers. Then they coordinate long-term care and train and empower the home-health aides so they are equipped to go into homes and help with every activity. Lastly, they build out the platform to take care of everything else at that stage in life that can be difficult or frustrating such as taking care of groceries, medication, medical equipment or physician visits. The goal is to enable older adults to get back to what makes them happy in life and to live the life they had before the onset of their medical condition. Hometeam is led by Founder and CEO Josh Bruno.



HOPE LEWIS MOREHEALTH

MORE Health's mission is to offer access to the best physicians in the world when they are needed most: when a patient is faced with a critical, potentially life-changing illness such as cancer or heart disease. Led by Lewis, the team's vision is to become a virtual global hospital for serious illness by providing the highest quality of diagnosis and treatment for patients anywhere in the world.



DR. BETTINA EXPERTON HUMETRIX

Based on its ground-breaking health services research on aging, Humetrix has developed a series of award-winning mHealth platforms designed to empower individuals 50 and older in the United States and around the world to better manage their healthcare. iBlueButton, winner of three HHS industry innovation awards, uniquely decodes Medicare claims to automatically generate a user's longitudinal medical history securely on their own mobile device. Medicare beneficiaries see, on average, seven different providers a year, and the ability to share their health history at every point of care can be life- and cost-saving. Our app TENSIO helps more than 75 million American adults with hypertension better manage blood pressure, integrating data from self-monitoring devices and the user's specific medications and diagnoses with a system to generate ongoing notifications and alerts on the user's smartphone and Apple Watch. For active adults experiencing an emergency at home or abroad, the multi-language SOS QR allows emergency responders to immediately and securely access—in their own language—users' critical health information while automatically alerting their emergency contacts. Omada Health is an online program that strives to inspire long-term healthy habits. Its mission is to help employers and health plans tackle diabetes and heart disease in an engaging, effective and scalable way. Its 16-week program is designed to help individuals lose weight, which has been shown to help reduce behavioral risk factors for developing type 2 diabetes. The program is based on clinically-proven science and focuses on guiding participants toward reaching modest weight loss and activity goals through nutrition and behavioral changes. By combining the science of behavior change with personal support, participants are more likely to make permanent changes and improvements to their health. Additionally, Omada Health is one of several digital health companies to benefit from the recent move by HHS to provide reimbursement for Medicare patients taking part in diabetes prevention programs. SUSAN KRISTINIAK OURDIRECTIVES.ORG

Eighty percent of Americans would prefer to die at home, yet 60 percent die in the hospital—one-third in ICUs. This discrepancy between preference and reality can largely be attributed to the fact that many patients—even those with multiple serious illnesses—haven't completed and/or shared an advance directive. The failure to know and follow patients' end of life preferences leads to distress among family, inappropriate utilization of hospital resources and expenditures that don't serve patient interests. OurDirectives is an online platform that aims to dramatically increase the number of individuals with completed, shared and accessible advance directives to ensure that patients receive care consistent with their goals. It's a tool that facilitates the discussion, documentation and accessibility of advanced care planning and documentation, eliminating the many points of friction patients face to make their wishes known. OurDirectives is a Penn Medicine platform led by a team that includes Susan Kristiniak, DHA, MSN, Associate Director of Palliative Care.

WHAT INSPIRED YOU TO WORK WITH THE AGING POPULATION?

Tom Kottler, founder and CEO of HealthPrize Technologies, is an entrepreneur with an innovative approach to improving medication adherence. The results? Staggering success, particularly in the ever-important 50+ patient market. In a 2016 study of patients taking a branded cholesterol-lowering medication, for example, enrollment in the HealthPrize program led to an almost immediate 99 percent reduction in "gap days," or days late to refill. A study of patients with self-reported asthma or COPD, with an average age of 53.5, concluded with 92 percent reporting they would continue the program if able, and 95 percent said they would recommend the program. By designing a truly innovative and engaging digital platform, Kottler is bringing about behavior change, improving medication adherence and — most importantly — promoting better health outcomes for patients.

Her grace, strength and wit under incredibly trying circumstances, usually while in incredible pain, remain a guiding light for me. The costs, both financial and emotional of her life extension, have motivated me to work on end-of-life issues, as well as being concerned for the quality of life of older Americans.

For TowerView's co-founders, the challenge of managing medications is personal. Their college roommate and a fellow co-founder, Nick Valilis, was diagnosed with leukemia at 22. When he left the hospital, he had a war chest of medications he struggled to manage. TowerView quickly realized it wasn't just Nick who struggled with this problem: nearly 50 percent of patients don't take their medications as prescribed, resulting in 125,000 avoidable deaths every year. In the United States alone, 1 in 3 Americans suffer from a chronic illness that requires multiple medications, and their noncompliance costs insurance companies nearly \$100 billion every year in avoidable hospitalizations. TowerView offers a simple service for the elderly population, and it is covered by nine U.S. insurance companies (to date) so patients can receive the help they need for free. TowerView has shown incredible promise in delivering a solution to one of today's most challenging problems in healthcare. TowerView is led by CEO Rahul Jain.

WHAT INSPIRED YOU TO WORK WITH THE AGING POPULATION?

TowerView's co-founder and college roommate, Nick Valilis, was diagnosed with leukemia three months after we graduated from Duke and in his first week of medical school. Nick was discharged from the hospital with 10 medications and, even though he was a 22-year-old med student whose father is an oncologist, Nick struggled to manage his meds. We quickly learned he wasn't the only one, and it was our goal to create an end-to-end service to help those who needed it most—seniors. We're proud to bring together insurance companies, providers and pharmacies to make it easier for elderly, chronically ill patients to manage their health at home.



JAYANTHI NARASIMHAN WATCHRX

WatchRx was founded to help the elderly with multiple chronic conditions to manage their medications and health conditions remotely. Current solutions available in the market, like mobile apps and pill caps/bottles, didn't fit the need and only add to their confusion. 
WHO IS YOUR HEALTHCARE HERO?

WHAT INSPIRED YOU TO WORK WITH THE AGING POPULATION?

Every patient who comes to Cure Forward is given a guide to support them through the process of obtaining clinical data and posting a profile that clinical trial recruiters can view and use to determine matches for studies to screen at a trial site near the patient. Cure Forward is the opposite of scouring the internet for trial options—it brings the trials to the patient. Frank Ingari serves as CEO of Cure Forward.

Room2Care.com has created a brand-new option for senior living. Room2Care is a network of private caregiver homes in the geographic area desired by the senior. The senior or caregiver registers on the site, identifies their needs and is matched with a licensed or certified caregiver, who is renting a room and providing the care sought. The senior moves into the caregiver's home, creating a huge cost savings for the senior, as well as a job opportunity for a qualified caregiver. Room2Care.com is giving the vast majority of seniors access to living arrangements they could not otherwise afford through a traditional option. Room2Care is led by founders Dr. Todd Florin and Richard L. Ashenoff II.



WHAT INSPIRED YOU TO WORK WITH THE AGING POPULATION?

As the granddaughter and daughter of women with dementia, I saw firsthand the devastating impact of the disease. As an entrepreneur, I was also painfully aware of the complete dearth of effective, quality, scable solutions that can provide better health and wellbeing, not only for those with dementia but for their family caregivers as well. In the last 120 years, not a single pharmaceutical solution has been created to effectively prevent or treat this disease. This lack of solutions for dementia is not something you see in other areas of healthcare, and I was motivated to create a product that could help alleviate the suffering I saw firsthand. Our SingFit technology can be used to treat a variety of healthcare challenges, including chronic obstructive pulmonary disease, hypertension and autism, but we started with dementia and healthy cognitive aging because it's where we saw the most pressing and unattended opportunity to transform healthcare through active music.
