

Health History: Updated PCP Notification Process

The *Nursing Health History Assessment* has been updated: **PCP/personal provider** notification has been removed. The PCP notification process is now captured as part of the admissions process.



CMS Conditions of Participation Requirement

CMS Conditions of Participation §482.13(b)(4) - *The patient has the right to have a family member or representative of his or her choice and his or her own physician notified promptly of his or her admission to the hospital.*

The Joint Commission Requirement

The Joint Commission Hospital Accreditation Program standards correspond to CMS Conditions of Participation in RI.01.02.01 EP 1- *The hospital involves the patient in making decisions about his or her care, treatment, and services, including the right to have his or her family and physician promptly notified of his or her admission to the hospital.*

Admissions:

URGENT CARE REFERRAL

If you are admitted today would you like your PCP to be notified?

URGENT CARE CENTER PCP/REFERRAL

Was the PT referred from, or is the PCP an Urgent Care Center?

If OTHER, which Facility?

OBSERVATION/OUTPAT-IN-BED NOTIFICATION

Admissions will document if the patient wishes for the PCP to be notified.

An automated process will generate the patient's request for the PCP to be notified.
Please note: State requirements may impact this automated process.

Health History Assessment

The patient has a right to have a family member and or representative of his or her choice notified promptly of his or her admission to the hospital. If the patient is incapacitated or otherwise unable to communicate, the hospital must make reasonable efforts to identify and promptly notify a family member or representative.
