Applicant Name:

Dialysis Nurse (RN):

The Dialysis Nurse RN must have equivalent qualifications and competence as employed individuals performing the same or similar services at the facility.

Definition of Care or Service:

The Dialysis Nurse RN assists with patient care by performing hemodialysis, peritoneal dialysis and ultrafiltration procedures ordered by a physician. Scope of Service may include:

- Performs patient assessment and reassessment
- Participates in care planning and discharge planning/coordination
- Provides patient and family education
- Utilizes equipment to perform dialysis treatments
- Provides patient care during dialysis procedures which may include:
 - o Medication administration and management
 - o Administration of blood
 - Waived testing as defined by the facility
 - Use of Restraints or seclusion
 - Participation in patient consent process
 - Pain management
 - Coordination of care with other disciplines
 - Nutritional care
 - Hygiene (i.e., oral care, bathing)
 - Participation in operative or invasive procedures
- Participation in use of moderate sedation
- Maintains and secures patient data and records
- Documents care provided and procedure performed in the medical record as defined by facility policy
- Demonstrates Clinical and Service excellence behaviors to include code of HCA Healthcare conduct core fundamentals in daily interactions with patients, families, co-workers and physicians

Setting(s):

- Healthcare facilities including but not limited to hospitals, outpatient treatment facilities, imaging centers, and physician practices
- Dialysis procedures may occur in the patient's room
- The facility should specify where dialysis procedures may occur

Supervision:

- Direct supervision by nursing department director, site manager or designee
 - Indirect supervision by physician or other licensed independent practitioner that prescribes the dialysis procedures

Evaluator: Department director or designee in conjunction with supervising physician or licensed independent Practitioner

Qualifications:

- Associates degree or higher
- Current RN License
- American Heart Association or Red Cross health care provider BLS Certification

Preferred Qualifications:

• Certification in Nephrology Nursing

State Requirements:

• Current RN License in practicing state

Experience:

• 1 year experience as a Dialysis Nurse (RN)

Competencies:

The Dialysis Nurse (RN) will demonstrate:

- Safe and effective operation of dialysis equipment
 - o Maintains equipment in good working order
 - o Demonstrates effective infection control practices related to equipment operation
- Accurate patient information review and evaluation
 - Uses at least two ways to identify patients before treating or performing a procedure
 - Verifies that the requested procedure correlates with the patient's clinical history, presentation and physician order
 - Participates in the pre-procedure process to verify the correct procedure, for the correct patient, at the correct site and involves the patient in the verification process when possible
 - Accesses the patient medical record appropriately
 - o Documents in the medical record according to the facility standard / policy
- Provides patient care during the dialysis treatment
 - Accesses, monitors and maintains the patient's dialysis access site with appropriate sterile and / or aseptic technique
 - Administers medications during dialysis treatment per facility policy
 - o Operates facility specific patient care equipment safely
 - IV Pumps
 - Cardiac Monitors
 - o Demonstrates competency in performing waived testing
 - o Provides patient and family education about dialysis treatments
 - Participates in hand off communication with the other members of the patient's healthcare team
 - Notifies the appropriate health provider when immediate treatment is necessary, based on procedural findings and patient conditions
 - Recognizes the need for an urgent report and takes appropriate action
 - Initiates treatments for patient condition change within scope of practice
 - Utilizes the facility emergency response team appropriately
- Infection Prevention
 - Practices consistent hand hygiene
 - Uses personal protective equipment (PPE)



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- Required immunizations per Division requirements
- Complies with Isolation precautions
- Maintains sterile field
