Name of Dependent Healthcare Professional (DHP):

Physical Therapy Assistant:

The Physical Therapist Assistant must have equivalent qualifications and competence as employed individuals performing the same or similar services at the facility.

Definition of Care or Service:

The Physical Therapist Assistant serves as a member of the physical therapy team by assisting the Physical Therapist. A licensed physical therapist shall at all times be responsible for all the physical therapy services provided by the physical therapy assistant. Scope of Service may include:

- Delivers patient treatments as directed by Physical Therapist
- Documents treatment outcomes in the medical record
- Participates in discharge planning
- Delivers patient/family/caregiver education
- Demonstrates Clinical and Service excellence behaviors to include code of HCA conduct core fundamentals in daily interactions with patients, families, co-workers and physicians

Setting(s):

- Healthcare facilities including but not limited to hospitals, outpatient treatment facilities, imaging centers and physician practices
- Patient care areas, all settings

Supervision:

- Direct supervision by department director, site manager or designee
 - o Indirect supervision by licensed physical therapist

Evaluator: Physical Therapy department Director or designee

Qualifications:

- Completion of an accredited physical therapy program
- Certified by the Commission on Accreditation in Physical therapy Education (CAPTE)

State Requirements:

• N/A

Experience:

At least 1 year experience as a physical therapist assistant

Competencies:

The Physical Therapy Assistant will demonstrate:

- Safe and effective operation of physical therapy equipment
 - o Consistently obtains quality diagnostic outputs
 - o Maintains equipment in good working order
 - o Demonstrates effective infection control practices related to equipment operation
- Accurate patient information review and evaluation
 - o Uses at least two ways to identify patients before treating or performing a procedure
 - Verifies that the requested procedure correlates with the patient's clinical history, presentation and physician order
 - o Participates in the pre-procedure process to verify the correct procedure, for the correct patient, at the correct site and involves the patient in the verification process when possible
 - Accesses the patient medical record appropriately
 - o Documents in the medical record according to the facility standard / policy
 - Appropriate Diagnostic Examination Results



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- o Performs physical therapy plan to comply with applicable protocols and treatment guidelines
- o Utilizes outcome measures to assess the results of interventions administered to patients
- o Notifies the appropriate health provider when immediate treatment is necessary, based on procedural findings and patient condition
- o Provides a written or oral summary of preliminary finding to licensed Physical Therapist
- Infection Prevention
 - o Practices consistent hand hygiene
 - Uses personal protective equipment (PPE)
 - o Maintains current immunization for influenza
 - o Complies with Isolation precautions
