Chaplain:

The Chaplain must have equivalent qualifications, competence and function in the same role as employed individuals performing the same or similar services at the facility, as defined by facility job description.

Definition of Care or Service:

The Chaplain performs those functions necessary for the spiritual needs of the patient to include grief and loss counseling. Scope of Service may include:

- Performs and/or manages the following safely and efficiently:
 - o Performing spiritual assessments
 - o Participating in patient care conferences and medical rounds
 - Assists patients and families on end of life issues
 - Screening for risk which can involve identifying individuals whose religious/spiritual belief may conflict with/or affect treatment decisions
 - Facilitate communication among staff members, patients, caregivers to include conflict resolution
 - Provide crisis intervention, grief and loss counseling
 - Facilitate understanding of confidentiality issues
 - Assists with decision making and communication regarding decedent affairs
 - Serve as liaison between hospital and its community (ex. Ethics committee)
- Demonstrates Clinical and Service excellence behaviors to include code of HCA conduct core fundamentals in daily interactions with patients, families, co-workers and physicians.
