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| <p>Rounding Nurse (RN): The Rounding Nurse (RN) must have equivalent qualifications, competence and function in the same role as employed individuals performing the same or similar services at the facility, as defined by facility job description.</p> <p>Definition of Care or Service: The Rounding Nurse (RN) acts under the direction and supervision of the physician to facilitate safe results and optimal patient outcomes. Scope of Service may include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Assures quality patient care through coordination of patient care with members of the patient care team. As directed by the physician, makes patient rounds, apply the nursing process (assessment, planning, intervention, & evaluation), changes dressing, removes sutures, performs patient teaching, discharge planning, and/or document in the patient medical record (must be countersigned by physician within 24 hours). Works in accordance with facility policies, procedures, Texas Nurse Practice Act, related laws, and regulations. Demonstrates clinical and service excellence behaviors to include code of HCA Healthcare conduct core fundamentals in daily interactions with patients, families, co-workers and physicians. |

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Experience:

- Minimum of one year recent experience in the specialty

Competencies:

The Rounding Nurse (RN) will demonstrate:

- Consistent practice within limitations of preparation, experience, and scope of practice as defined by MHS under the appropriate level of direct/ indirect supervision.
- Accurate patient information review and evaluation through:
 - Accesses the patient medical record appropriately maintaining confidentiality & privacy in accordance with HIPAA regulations.
- Assisting with procedures: Possesses an advanced working knowledge of aseptic principles & techniques:
 - Follows hazardous materials management guidelines found on facility (Intranet)
 - Consistently using personal protective equipment
 - Follow MHS guidelines for hand hygiene & using sanitizer before entry into a patient room and upon exit.
- Medication Management:
 - Follows MHS policy for verification and labeling of medications
 - According to physician's orders, prepares medications and solutions for use during procedures & communicates information to the MHS patient care team.
- Is knowledgeable about all current National Patient Safety goals as defined by the Joint Commission and applies them consistently and appropriately to all patients. (i.e. use of 2 patient identifiers (name & date of birth)).
- Makes rounds in addition to physician, not in lieu of; conveys physician orders; documents in the medical record (must be countersigned by physician within 24 hours). The nurse may not dictate history & physicals or operative reports.
- Infection Prevention
 - Practices consistent hand hygiene
 - Uses personal protective equipment (PPE)
 - Required immunizations per DHP Division requirements
 - Complies with Isolation precaution
- Consistently maintains a safe environment for patients.
- Assess for fall risks prior to exit of patient room
- Ensure patient call light is in close proximity to the patient
- Encourage patient to call for assistance if needed
- Performs accurate patient information review and evaluation:
 - Collects and documents assessment data into the patient medical record. Entries in the medical record are countersigned by the attending physician within 24 hours.
 - Facilitates communication between the physician, patient, family and patient care staff.
 - Notifies the appropriate member of the interdisciplinary patient care team of issues that require immediate intervention or attention.
- Maintains adequate knowledge about utilized equipment operation and basic troubleshooting.*****The RN has the burden of proof to show documentation of training*****
 - Has been trained and can validate correct operation of any utilized equipment.
 - Reports any equipment not functioning correctly immediately to a MHS staff member.
 - Has been trained and can demonstrate basic troubleshooting of any utilized equipment.
- Consistently applies nursing process (including assessment, planning, intervention, and evaluation),

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performs necessary patient teaching, and discharge planning; documents in patient medical record and communicates information to necessary caregivers.

- Collects and documents assessment data into the patient medical record.
