# Video Streaming

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Apps for streaming, uploading and sharing video are huge for events right now. The web is getting faster and faster, which makes video a more viable possibility than ever before. Event planners have to get creative in how they use this channel of communication.

## 1. Facebook Live

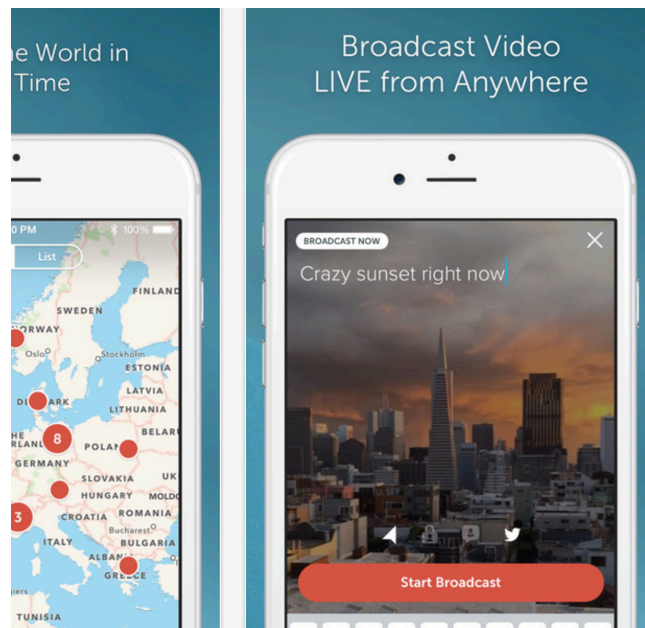

In Spring of 2016, Facebook released Facebook Live, a live streaming service that allows users to live stream events from their personal account or event page. After the live event is over, the recorded video can then be saved and shared as usual. Users can interact via comments, likes and emotional reactions, resulting in very high engagement because people are so active on Facebook during the course of the day. Most users are familiar with Facebook and already have the app on their phone.

## 2. Periscope

Periscope is owned by Twitter and thus, is deeply integrated into the famous 140-character network. Noted as the easiest live stream program, a user simply logs in, sets a phone on a tripod or sturdy shelf and hits a button to go live. Videos can then be replayed or embedded onto a website. Currently, Periscope is partnering with GoPro to enable GoPro camera streaming capabilities, which will be great for sports and other active events.



## 3. UStream

UStream is live streaming platform that starts at \$99. It has more capabilities than Facebook Live and Periscope as you are able to brand video content and use multiple cameras. It is easy for the user as they simply enter a link into their browser. This is where UStream departs from competitor LiveStream as you need to log in to view a stream with that platform. UStream does offer a free trial.

## Organization

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There are a lot of moving parts when it comes to pulling off an incredible event. The following apps are great for helping you stay organized through the thick and thin of the different planning and execution stages.

### 4. Evernote

Evernote is an app that will keep you organized. You can make to-do lists, organize projects and share them with your team selectively. Evernote has a wonderful search feature that can find even hand written words scribbled on notecards. Which bring us to our next app...



### 5. Evernote Scannable

Evernote Scannable makes it easy to say goodbye to your clunky scanner/printer. Simply snap a pic on your phone or tablet and it is saved as a jpg or pdf. Keep your receipts for each task and job. Simply add it to your task in Evernote. Both Evernote and Evernote Scannable are free with paid options.

### 6. Asana

Asana takes task management to the next level, while staying in your budget (they have a robust free option). Excellent for teams to use, Asana is easy and intuitive. You can create tasks, deadlines, share, delegate and attach just about anything. This is the app that can get a team with many responsibilities organized fast.

## 7. Slack

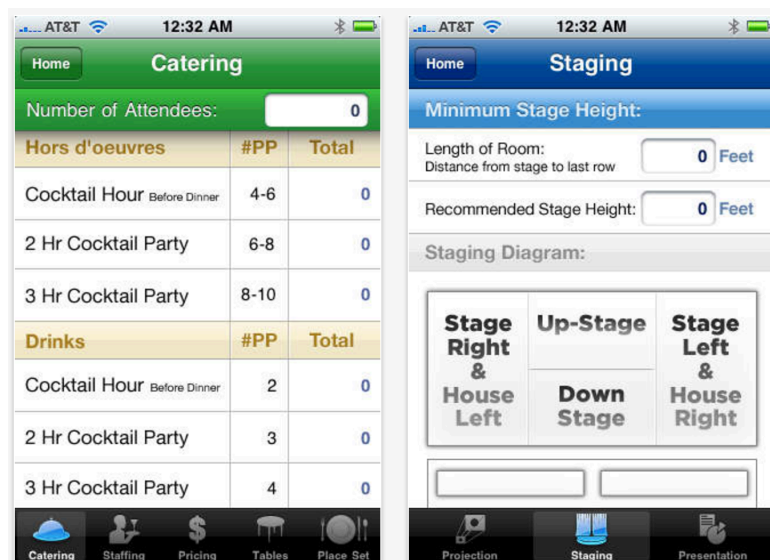

Messages can be public, shared with a few or shared between two people in a direct message. ## 8. SupperPlanner

This app will tell you. It will also tell you how big your dance floor should be and a number of other very useful things. It is an event encyclopedia in the palm of your hand.



## 9. Google Drive

Hopefully Google Drive isn't new to anyone, however, this app is worth a mention. It remains one of the easiest ways to share/store spreadsheets and collaborative information with other people. Share photos, menus, pricing spreadsheets, and comments between team members. Plus, it provides a ton of free storage.

## 10. Smartsheet

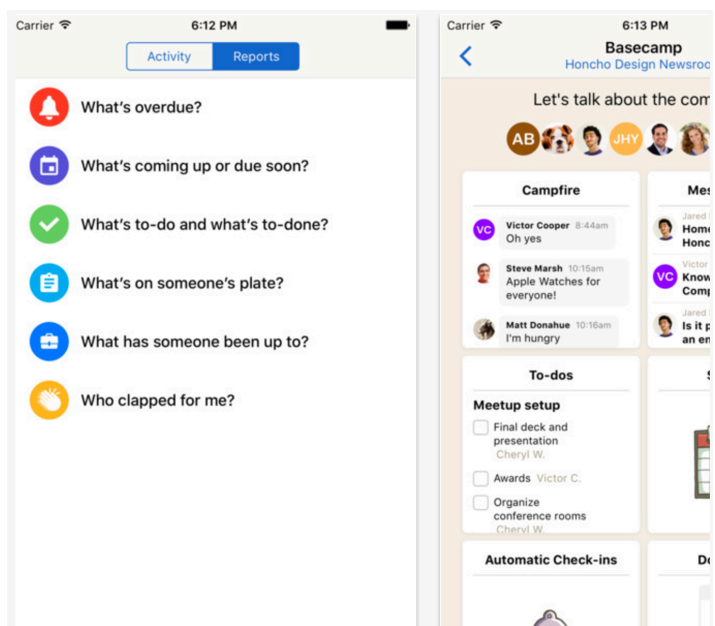

## 12. Rapportive

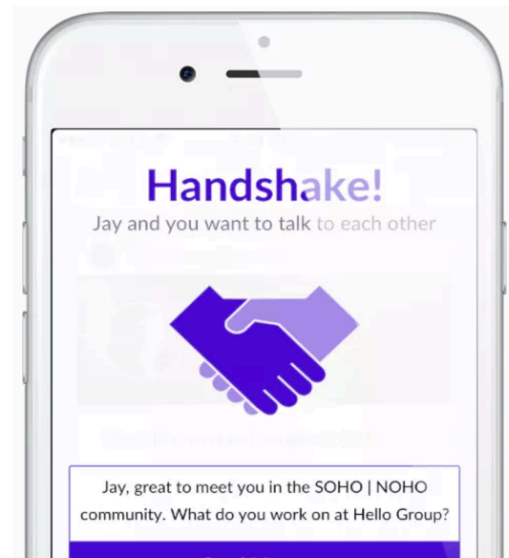

Rapportive is a Gmail extension for social media research. Social media websites like LinkedIn load information while Rapportive displays a picture right into your inbox. Search for speakers, colleagues, employees and more. Find out if they are in the area and arrange to meet up. Also see which contacts you may have in common. The extension is free for Firefox and Chrome browsers.

## 13. Grip

Grip, formerly known as Networkr, is a boon for weary networkers everywhere. Grip is a location-based service that loads LinkedIn profiles into a easy-to-use Tinder like swipe interface. Who has the time and energy to work a room figuring out who has similar interests or business objectives? With Grip, attendees can spend that time interacting with the right person instead of finding them.

## 14. Hootsuite

Hootsuite lets you send messages to multiple social media networks at one time. If you've tried it the other way around – especially when you have many messages to send – you'll know this is a huge time saver. At 10



million users, this is one of the most popular social media management programs around. Hootsuite also has the ability to schedule messages on a handy calendar (even in bulk from a .csv file). Free programs and paid subscriptions are available.

## 15. Buffer

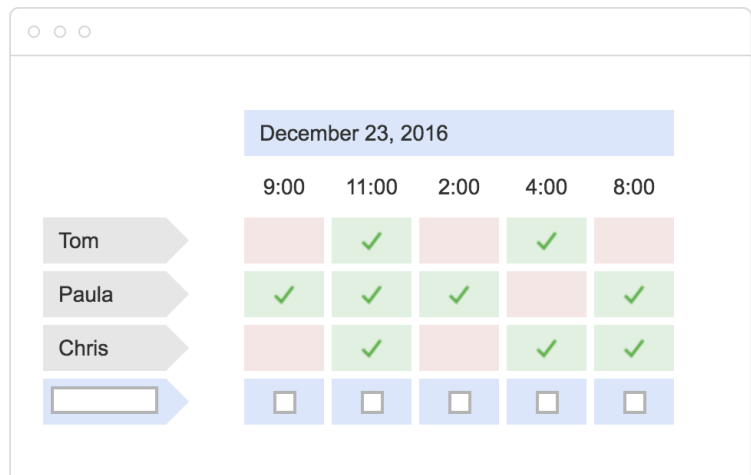

There are less features than its competitor Hootsuite, but it still posts to major social media networks and has recently added a tool that works with posting to Instagram. There is a tool to overlay text/quotes onto images to either share or download. Free plans are available as are paid subscriptions.

It allows you to create an event, add in ticket types, build an event website and send out invitations all on one, easy-to-use application. It also integrates with social media for promotion purposes, helps manage sponsors, attendee surveys and feedback. At this time, Bizzabo doesn't offer auction or seating features but is working on adding these items.

## 18. Boomset

Meant for trade shows, expos, conventions and conferences, this innovative on-site technology solution provides tools to help event organizers with productivity and efficiency. From event registration to event lifecycle, you can do things like create guest lists by uploading contacts from Excel, Eventbrite, Meetup, Facebook and others. Users can print name tags as guests check in. Boomset is also good for lead retrieval. Get a custom price quote on their website.

## 19. Eventbrite

Eventbrite is great for event registration, especially for the budget-conscious planner. Best part? This software is free. Eventbrite will help with designing an event webpage, handling multiple ticket types, discount codes and merchandise. You can promote the event through custom links, invitations and social media. There are easy online payment features as well as income tracking.

## **21. Planning Pod**

From start to finish, Planning Pod is a value-based organizational app designed just for event planners. The pricing is a monthly fee based on how many events you are juggling at one time. This amazing app helps with designing floor plans, tracking invoices, generating leads and proposal templates, among other things. Planning Pod is a one-stop shop for all things events. Prices range from \$9.99 per month to \$69.99 per month. A free 30-day trial is available.

## **22. Caterease**

Caterease is a very popular event planning application. It was designed for event planners and covers all aspects of the event. From billing to managing customer data, venues and wait staff, Caterease can help. Users love the training feature, though it is not free. Caterease pricing starts at \$65/month and a free trial is available.

## **Live Engagement**

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Beacon technology at events offers limitless possibilities. Once an attendee downloads the customized event app, the possibilities of attendee engagement start to skyrocket. Beacons work with Bluetooth technology; some are tracking devices placed on venue walls where others are small and wearable.



## 23. Event2mobile

Event2mobile (E2M) makes beacon-integrated event apps and designs them for events, conferences and conventions. The event2mobile apps boost audience engagement as attendees can check in, network with other attendees, and receive push notifications like agenda, exhibitor info and more. For the planner, E2M provides valuable data in understanding audience engagement activity and lets you promote sponsors and exhibitors through alerts. E2M promises to be one of the most secure event apps and works with many of the world's top financial institutions. Pricing ranges from \$1,500-\$10,000.



## 24. Loopd

Loopd provides a wearable beacon that attaches to a lanyard. Beacon wearers share all contact information. Marketing materials are distributed and gamification options are available. Planners and interested parties receive extensive analytics. Real-time measurements include number of attendees, number of networking connections and how much time people are spending at key sponsor booths or exhibitors. Heat maps of the crowd flow can be generated at any time. Pricing starts at \$2-\$5 for device rental per attendee, plus \$6,000-\$10,000 per event for analytics. A \$5,000 is also assessed for the integrated app.

## 25. DoubleDutch

DoubleDutch provides a live engagement event app with a wide range of possibilities. Inform attendees through



push notifications, drive engagement through posts on your shared app and communicate through location-based beacon technology. DoubleDutch can deliver all kinds of specialized information very quickly. From gamification to live polling, DoubleDutch gets the pulse of your event. Pricing varies.
