

## CONSENT FOR ADMINISTRATION OF QBCHECK

### **DO NOT SIGN THIS FORM WITHOUT READING AND UNDERSTANDING WHAT IT SAYS**

*If the test taker does not have legal authority, under the laws of the state or jurisdiction in which he or she resides, to consent to the administration of the QbCheck test, the parent or legal guardian of the test taker may accept and agree to the foregoing representations and acknowledgements on his or her behalf.*

I understand that my treating practitioner has ordered the administration of QbCheck. QbCheck is a software-based test designed to measure the three core symptoms of Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (commonly known as “ADHD”): hyperactivity, inattention and impulsivity. The QbCheck test will be taken at a computer. No medications, needles or physical contact is required. The QbCheck test will involve a system check of the computer, instructions on how to perform a QbCheck, a practice test, a QbCheck and the presentation of results. In taking the QbCheck test, I will watch and/or listen to certain information and prompts and will respond using a keyboard. The following data will be obtained and stored in order to operate QbCheck: date of birth (year and month), gender, country of residence, test data, and potential diagnoses and medications affecting the test performance. I understand that the QbCheck test is completely voluntary. I understand that there is a charge for the QbCheck test and that my treating provider may require me to pay this charge at the time of the test. I understand that this charge may not be covered by my insurance.

I understand that my treating practitioner will provide me with the results of the QbCheck test. The QbCheck report will present an overall ADHD symptom level indicator score, scores on all the three main symptoms of ADHD, a visual presentation of the test data and data for comparison. No results will be presented at-home but will be available at my treating practitioner’s office.

I understand that my QbCheck test results are not intended to be a stand-alone diagnosis of ADHD. Rather, my QbCheck test results will merely provide an indication of my risk of having ADHD. I understand that only a qualified health care practitioner may provide a clinical diagnosis of ADHD. If my QbCheck test results indicate that I am at risk for having ADHD, I understand that my treating practitioner may recommend further clinical assessment to determine whether I have ADHD I understand that I should not change my health behaviors based on my QbCheck test results alone.

**I understand that possible benefits** associated with QbCheck include the discovery of information regarding my risk for having ADHD.

**I understand that material risks** associated with the QbCheck test include the following:

- The results of my QbCheck test may contain some information that provokes a strong emotional response.
- The results of my QbCheck test may indicate that I am at low risk for having ADHD even if I do in fact have ADHD. Based on such results, my treating practitioner may determine that further clinical assessment is not appropriate, and, as a result, my ADHD may not be further assessed or diagnosed.
- The results of my QbCheck test may indicate that I am at high risk for having ADHD even if I do not in fact have ADHD. Based on such results, my treating practitioner may recommend further clinical assessment.
- There may be technical issues that occur during the QbCheck test, such as loss of power or internet connection, malfunction of the camera, environmental issues and other technical or equipment complications. If these occur and result in an incomplete test, QbCheck will need to be performed again.
