Getting qualified opens up many career opportunities

With a range of care settings, working hours and the emergence of new job roles, an aged care or disability care qualification opens up many career pathways. To name a few...

Personal care worker

The role of the personal care worker is to provide physical care, emotional support and help with day-to-day tasks. This may be in a clinic, hospital or residential care facility and vary in the level of care required.

Aged care supervisor

As an aged care supervisor you'll be a front-line manager with strong leadership skills. This role requires you to be responsible for ensuring that your team members undertake relevant professional development and training to assist them in their roles.

Care program coordinator

As a care program coordinator you'll be responsible for designing and developing a program of activities for older clients that works in tandem with care plans provided by other health care providers.

Home care assistant

In this role you'll assist individuals with daily tasks within their homes. From assisting with personal care to helping with errands, the key focus to the home care assistant's job is to make the individual's life easier and more comfortable.
