A Message from Leadership

We value our Discovery Land Company (DLC) and Discovery Builders (DB) families and their health, and one of our goals as we proceed toward the “new normal” is to remain vigilant in doing our part to protect everyone.

We therefore have decided that during this transition period, all individuals entering DLC properties will be checked for the presence of a fever. An individual found to have a temperature greater than 100.4°F (38°C) will be denied entrance to the properties until either the individual has been tested for COVID-19, has been cleared by a healthcare provider, or has remained in quarantine for 7 days after symptoms have abated.

We understand that in all likelihood an elevated temperature would not be due to COVID-19. However, until better tools are available, or the pandemic passes, the risk of spreading the disease throughout our community is too great to ignore the resources that we do have at our disposal.

We appreciate your cooperation with this inconvenience. We are hopeful that such requirements will be short-lived and we can all get back to normal operations in the near future.

Temperature Testing Guidelines



Everyone entering DLC Properties must be checked for a fever

- This new policy is for the protection of guests and employees



Those found to have a temperature over 100.4°F (38°C) will be denied entry until:

- Negative test for COVID-19
- Cleared by a healthcare provider
- Remained quarantined for 7 days without symptoms



Encourage all guests to maintain a social distance of 6 ft or more

- When unable to maintain this distance, encourage guests to wear a facial mask or covering

Additional Precautions



Encourage employees and guests to wash or sanitize their hands at least every 20 minutes



Sanitize surfaces, including thermometers, after each guest interaction



Wear a mask or facial covering to protect yourself and others



Monitor for other symptoms: dry cough and shortness of breath are also symptoms of COVID-19
