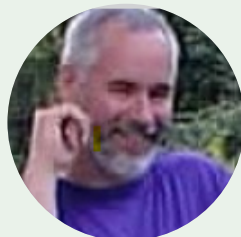




Caregiver's Guide to Death and Dying - Hospice 101
