## IRS Further Extends Additional Federal Tax Filing Deadlines



The IRS announced on April 9, 2020 that it has further extended additional tax filing deadlines.

Building upon the March announcement that extended the federal income tax filing and payment deadline from April 15 to July 15, the new guidance applies to additional returns, tax payments, and other actions. The new extension provides the following relief:

- All taxpayers with a filing or payment deadline between April 1, 2020 and July 15, 2020 can now wait until July 15, 2020 to file and pay federal taxes.
- Individuals, trusts, estates, corporations, and other non-corporate entities qualify for the July 15 deadline.
- The extension also includes Americans who live and work abroad.
- Estimated quarterly tax payments due June 15, 2020 have now been extended to July 15, 2020 without penalty.
- Any taxpayer filing a tax return for unclaimed 2016 refunds will now have until July 15, 2020 to file within the required three-year window.
- Individual taxpayers can request a filing extension to Oct. 15, 2020. This will only extend the filing deadline, not the deadline for payment of any taxes owed. To avoid interest and penalties, payments should be made by July 15.
