FROM THE PRINCIPAL . . .


God has chosen you to BE HUMBLE AND GENTLE

(Example: If you live in Cedarburg and the Cedarburg school district has closed due to the weather, consider keeping your child home from school that day.)

In the event that a sudden snowstorm forces school to close before the regular closing time, make certain that your child knows exactly where to go and what to do should no one be home during the school day.

Building a Culture of Student Safety

A recent visitor to Milwaukee Lutheran commented to me that our school seemed very safe and secure (and quiet). He asked questions about the adult hallway monitors and the number of staff members who were walking (patrolling) about through the building. He wanted to know if these were security measures put in place because of school violence elsewhere. As I later reflected on our chat, I started thinking about what makes a school safe, and are we, in fact, keeping our students safe and secure here at Milwaukee Lutheran High School.

- The key component in preventing school violence is developing a positive school climate based on safety, respect, trust, and emotional support. Teachers and staff support open communication and conflict resolution with students. Students need to feel empowered to share concerns with adults without fear of being labeled "a snitch." This first step of building positive, trusting relationships with students is key. Listening and taking an interest in the lives of students builds that trust.
- 2. Empowering students to take an active role by sharing concerns and problems with a trusted adult is another key component. We need to break down the "codes of silence" and encourage students to understand the possible implications of thinking that problems will disappear by ignoring them. Working with partners or in groups for class assignments and projects builds trust among the students and creates more lines of communication among them.
- 3. Another component is to encourage and support our students to become active in a club or team activity. Students who are socially active, foster positive relationships. Sports, music, art, forensics, science, drama, dance, and Bible study are but a few of the social activities available. Students are also encouraged to take advantage of field trips to foster academic or career learning experiences, as well as social interactions which improve behavior.
- 4. We pray for each other and for our school. "God's Got This" is our new mantra. We read in 2 Corinthians 12: 9, "My grace is sufficient for you, for My power is made perfect in weakness." We rest secure knowing that God is in control and that our trust is in Him. When students and staff are at our weakest, we turn to Christ's almighty power for our strength and comfort.

While teachers and staff can foster relationships and open lines of communication with students, it is the students themselves that have the leading role to play in sustaining a safe school culture. Students need to be actively engaged in the life of our school. We encourage them to reach out to classmates who seem lonely or isolated. We empower them to report acts of gossip, teasing, or bullying when they witness them. We recognize that we are a family here at Milwaukee Lutheran, and that as a family, we rally around those who are struggling or in need.



Re: Re-enrollment in MLHS for 2019-2020 School Year

Dear MLHS Parents/Guardian:

Re-enrollment for the 2019-20 school year is approaching. You will need to complete 2 separate steps to re-enroll to Milwaukee Lutheran for the 2019-2020 school year.

STEP 1:

A. For all our current Choice families, our first Milwaukee Parental Choice Program (MPCP) Open Enrollment Period begins <u>February 1, 2019</u> and ends <u>February 20, 2019</u> (WPCP is February 1 - April 20, 2019). Beginning February 1, you will need to log in at <u>dpi.wi.gov/choice</u> with the email and password that you used last year. **EVERY CURRENT CHOICE STUDENT MUST RE-APPLY EVERY YEAR!**

It is STRONGLY recommended that you apply for CHOICE during the February open enrollment period, as all our MPCP seats will be filled during that month, and you will most likely be on a wait list if you apply after February. We can NOT guarantee your student a CHOICE seat at Milwaukee Lutheran if you apply during a later open enrollment period! If you have any Choice questions, please contact Debbie Janke at choice@milwaukeelutheran.org or 414-461-6000 ext. 253.

B. For all our current tuition families, please note that your billing account will be rolled over automatically, and you will receive a letter in April or May letting you know that it has been done.

STEP 2:

Beginning February 1st, you will need to log into your Skyward account and walk through the prompts for completing the reenrollment process. If you need Skyward login/password information, please contact Cate Dummann at cdummann@milwaukeelutheran.org or 414-461-6000 ext. 213.

Students will be picking their classes for next year in February during designated classes. Look for your student to bring home a copy of their chosen classes during that time.

We look forward to continuing to serve your family next year.


