## **FROM THE PRINCIPAL . . .** God has chosen you to DO YOUR BEST IN ALL THINGS



As we read Paul's words that precede this section of Scripture, we see that he is addressing the issue about Christians having to follow the dietary restrictions of the Jews. Paul shows that those regulations have been removed, and there is freedom to consume whatever food one wants to eat. He is telling them that because of Jesus Christ they have freedom.

We often use this verse as an encouragement to work hard, but I fear even that message can be taken out of context. He is not giving us free license to do as we desire. God is not saying that all of our actions are pleasing in his sight. He is also not saying that we should just try to please everyone.

Rather this entire portion of Scripture is a reminder that everything we do needs to point back to Jesus Christ. All our actions, our thoughts, our motives should be focused on bringing glory back to God. Our actions should not be based on what we like best, but on what is best for those around us. That is what God demonstrated for us. He sacrificed everything He had to give us His best – His one and only Son Jesus Christ. Christ lived a perfect life and gave up His life for us. He triumphed over death and the grave for us. He chose us, not because we live our lives perfectly and always bring glory back to Him, but because He wanted to give us freedom. How we use that freedom should be centered on drawing attention to our Heavenly Father rather than pulling it to ourselves. God has chosen us to use that freedom to do our best in everything – to work for the Lord.

## ACT Testing Day on February 20

The State of Wisconsin requires high schools to administer ACT testing to all juniors each spring. The ACT Plus Writing will be given on Wednesday, February 20<sup>th</sup>. With this being a special testing day, <u>we will dismiss early at 12:30 pm</u>. All students, freshmen through juniors, will be required to be in attendance. The juniors will be taking their ACT while the freshmen and sophomore students will be testing on practice ACT interims, getting them ready for the real ACT their junior year. Senior students should take the day to visit colleges, job-shadow or work on scholarships.

We will resume a normal school day on Thursday, February 21<sup>st</sup>, with the exception of juniors, who need to complete part two of testing known as ACT Work Keys. Once they complete the Work Keys, they will return to class.

A few notes for ACT Testing:

- Your child is already registered for these exams
- Tests are completely free
- ACT is a national standardized test required by most colleges and universities for admission
- ACT Work Keys is an exam which measures career readiness

- Accomodations have already been filed and approved for all Transition students



parents that I couldn't read what was on the chalkboards in the classroom. It wasn't news to me. I couldn't, so I would walk up to the boards to see what was written on them. I was struggling with nearsightedness and it was getting worse. I remember walking into the classroom a few weeks later sporting my new glasses. In addition to seeing the chalkboard clearly, I was amazed to see other things in the room that had just been blurs. What a blessing sight can be! Since that time, I have added farsightedness and bifocals to my list of special gifts. As Christians we all sometimes struggle with cloudy vision. Pain, suffering, disappointments,

I began wearing glasses when I was in the seventh grade. I remember my teacher telling my

As Christians we all sometimes struggle with cloudy vision. Pain, suffering, disappointments, poor choices, unfinished tasks, or other people affect our ability to see God's love clearly. We focus on the "wrongs" in our lives rather than on the gifts we possess. We avoid the issue, or blame someone else for our problem, or we cause hurt to someone as we lash out at them. We become blind to the injustice we cause to ourselves and others. I call this spiritual nearsightedness.

This condition prevents us from seeing the cross of Christ towering over all those hurts, disappointments, choices, tasks, and relationships that pervade our lives. We need to recognize that they are all washed away by the blood of the Lamb. Christ gave his life so that we would be forgiven.

Jesus was not nearsighted or farsighted, but rather cross-eyed. He focused on His mission to live a sinless life, to die on the cross for our sins, and to rise again for all of us, His children. When we are tempted to be nearsighted, we need to refocus on Jesus Christ, so that our eyesight can remain cross-eyed.


