FROM THE PRINCIPAL . . .

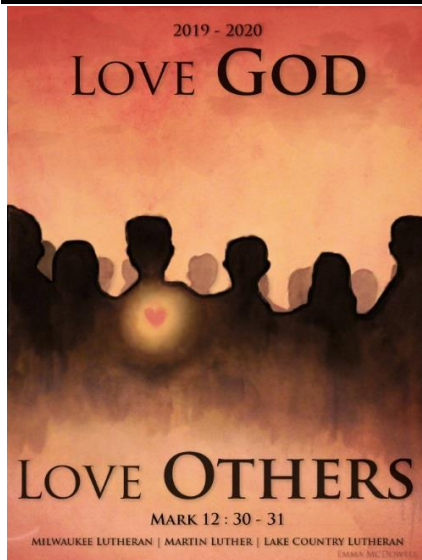
Love God with all your SOUL by ... baptizing all nations

My mother was fond of using the old maxim, “Sticks and stones may break my bones, but words will never hurt me.” It may have been true back then, and maybe still is, at least in the physical sense, but now the devil has upped his game. Words you would probably never say to a person directly, are now typed and sent without a moment’s hesitation. Students are using their own social media accounts to self-destruct. The fifth of our core values is LOVE. We strive to emulate Christ’s love for others in all school situations. Even in discipline we find opportunities to show compassion, joy, and care for our students. We enforce our discipline policies because we love, not because we have a need to punish students. “The Lord disciplines the one he loves and chastises every son/daughter whom he receives.” Heb. 12:6. Law and Gospel are intertwined in each of our policies.

Social media can be a great tool for good if used appropriately. Embrace the culture of love and forgiveness and then text away.
