In 1993, NBA All-Star Charles Barkley appeared in a commercial with the infamous statement "I am not a role model." When taken in just that context, it came off as a dismissal of his responsibility as one of the best players in sports at the time. How could he simply neglect his opportunity to positively influence kids? However, he followed that statement up with "Parents should be role models. Just because I can dunk a basketball doesn't mean I should raise your kids." I think he is more correct than what he even realized.


Our kids (and many adults) are looking for role models. This is nothing new, as we have always followed athletes, musicians, actors and actresses to emulate. The problem is finding positive examples. We may not want to be role-models, but we need to be. We can't pass off the opportunity or responsibility to celebrities. Instead, we need to focus on instilling Christian values through our example. When people see the example being set they are more willing to participate and join. This is the reason why Paul writes the message to Titus:

In everything set them an example by doing what is good. In your teaching show integrity, seriousness, and soundness of speech that cannot be condemned, so that those who oppose you may be ashamed because they have nothing bad to say about us. (Titus 2:7-8)

God has chosen us for this noble undertaking. May we take advantage of our status as Christians to be a Godly example for those who see us live our lives in a way that is different from this world.

And we urge you, brothers and sisters, warn those who are **idle** (tardy)and disruptive (misbehaving). (God) <u>1 Thessalonians 5:14</u>

This week's missive has both "good" news and "bad" news as they pertain to school attendance. First the "Bad" news. I am constantly amazed each morning as I write out Tardy Passes for students who are late to school. Apparently, punctuality is no longer a word used in "real life" by a large percentage of our school population. This morning we recorded 88 students as being Tardy to school, some by a few minutes, others by as much as an hour or more. That constitutes 11% of the school population here at MLHS. I have also been tracking hourly attendance for hours 2-8. Yesterday, there were 103 students who were late to two or more classes during the day. That makes up 12% of the school population. Clearly, we need to make a change in this perception of being "on-time" to work.

Now for the "good" news. Overall school attendance yesterday was 97%. This has been one of our best days this term. So, many are late, but the majority do manage to attend. Here's a breakdown by grade. The Freshman average daily attendance for the first 10 weeks of school is 96.3 %. The Frosh Rock! The Sophomores are is at 95%, while the Juniors have dropped to third place with a score of 94%. The Seniors continue to lag each week and have an average of only 93%. That makes our current year-to-date average weekly attendance 94.7 %. Our established goal for the school year is 97.4%. We still have a long way to go as we seek to change our MLHS culture.

School Culture is a way of life for us all here at Milwaukee Lutheran High School. We serve because we are Chosen by God (Colossians 3:12) to be his servants. We glorify God by serving His people through our lives of Christian Culture.

We look forward to working with all of you, our MLHS families, this year.


