## FROM THE PRINCIPAL . . .

### God has chosen you to BE HOLY

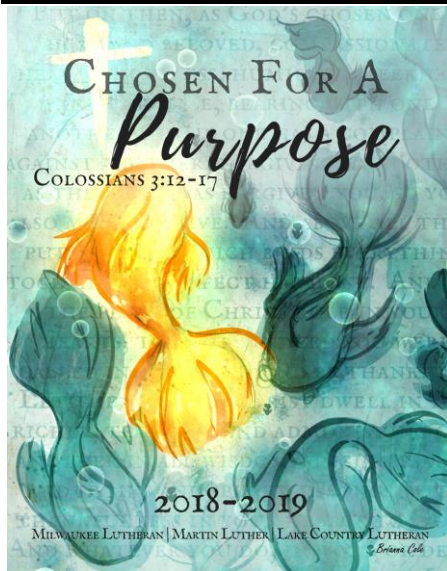
*Therefore, prepare your minds for action; be self-controlled; set your hope fully on the grace to be given you when Jesus Christ is revealed. As obedient children, do not conform to the evil desires you had when you lived in ignorance. But just as he who called you is holy, so be holy in all you do, for it is written: "Be holy, because I am holy." (1 Peter 1:13-15)*

Being holy means that we follow God's perfect standards. It calls us to avoid our evil desires and selfish ambitions. It means that we set ourselves apart from the world.

The command to be holy is one of the biggest challenges that I personally struggle with when reading Scripture. I know I'm not holy. I know I can't be holy. But the truth is that God knows I can't either. So why would He issue this declaration to me – and to you?

Because God is holy. Jesus Christ displayed his holiness by not succumbing to the trappings of this world. He stood apart – and stood alone when necessary – to show what holiness looked like. He demonstrated his holiness by going to the cross and shedding his blood for each of us. For though we remain sinners, we are simultaneously saints who have been justified by Christ.

Now, he calls us to be different. God knows that it is not healthy for us to remain in our sin after being rescued from it and so he calls us to stand apart from the world. He reminds us that conformity to evil will lead to our death. And so, we take assurance in the grace and forgiveness that he has given when we are not holy. We find the strength to be holy in God himself who promises to sustain and uphold us as we live our lives for Him. We remain alert, disciplined, and focused on the day when he will be revealed and return in glory. Because he has chosen us and calls us, we strive to live holy lives for Him.

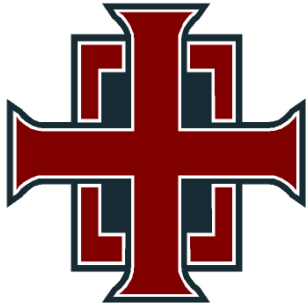
