FROM THE PRINCIPAL . . .

Set a Godly Example

In 2007, David Kinnaman of the Barna Group published a book titled *Unchristian*. The research examined the perspective that many non-Christians have of those who practice the Christian faith. This rapidly growing group of young non-Christians are losing respect for the Christian faith. A decade ago, when this book was published, the percentage of those who claim to have a “bad impression of present-day Christianity” was around 40%. My gut reaction is that the percentage has raised. Within that study, it was generalized that Christians are perceived as antihomosexual, judgmental, hypocritical, old-fashioned, insensitive, boring, and out of touch with reality.

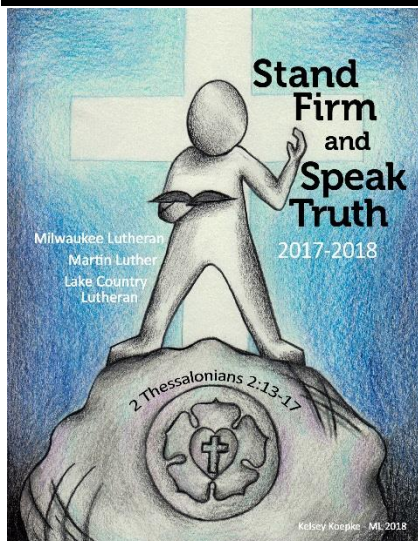
This is not the perception that we want as Christians. I believe that our perception is one of the greatest hurdles that Christians have to overcome. We also cannot waver on Biblical principles that God commands of us. How do we have influence and carry out the mission of sharing Jesus with individuals who are unreceptive to many Christians? How do we remain in touch with the reality of this world, and not succumb to its earthly trappings?

Part of the issue is that Christians remain sinners. As the world examines those of our faith, they can often find examples of those who are unable to have their actions match their words. While we know the reality of our sin, we are also not called to live a life of sin, but to strive to live a God-pleasing life. Because of our sin, we live as people reliant on God’s grace.

Others are watching for us to set a Godly example. This was the message that Paul writes to young Timothy. He instructs Timothy about avoiding the temptations that the world can offer. He reminds him of the gifts that God has blessed him with. He encourages him to use those gifts boldly despite opposition that he was facing.

We have put our hope in the living God, who is the Savior of all men, and especially of those who believe. Command and teach these things. Don’t let anyone look down on you because you are young, but set an example for the believers in speech, in life, in love, in faith, and in purity. (1 Timothy 4:10-12)

We, as Christians, are called to conduct our lives this way. Don’t shy away from Standing Firm on the hope that we have in Christ. Live your life in accordance with what Scripture teaches. Don’t be ashamed to Speak the Truth in love to those who need to hear its message of forgiveness and life. While it will not always be received and we may be rejected for our lifestyle, our God promises that His word is never empty. We can be his hands, feet, and mouthpiece that winsomely helps expand His Kingdom. May we always Stand Firm and Speak that Truth.

PSAT on WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 11 The PSAT is being administered on Wednesday, October 11 at Milwaukee Lutheran. A high score on the PSAT during your junior year has the potential to qualify you for the National Merit Scholarship competition which could translate into thousands of dollars in college scholarships. In the near future you will also be preparing to take other college entrance exams and this exam will help prepare you for many of those tests. To register for the PSAT, sign up in the Academic Advising Office by Thursday, October 5. The cost is \$20.00. Students taking the PSAT will be missing periods 1-5.

SENIORS and PARENTS: We will be hosting a **FAFSA application workshop on Tuesday, Nov. 7 from 6:30pm – 9:00pm**. All seniors seeking financial aid must fill out the FAFSA before going to college, no matter where they are going to attend. FAFSA is the Free Application for Federal Student Aid. We realize that the workshop isn't until November, but **we need everyone to RSVP if they want to attend. CAUTION - ROAD CONSTRUCTION

North 92nd Street, West Capitol Drive to West Hampton Avenue: The North 92nd Street, West Capitol Drive to West Hampton Avenue, construction project will switch from the east side of the project to the west side on Friday, September 22, 2017, with one lane of traffic in each direction on the completed east side.
