FROM THE PRINCIPAL . . .


Love God with all your SOUL by ... baptizing all nations

Tardy: idle, slow, delayed, overdue, late, not on time, or behind. (Webster's Thesaurus) And we urge you, brothers and sisters, warn those who are **idle** (tardy)and disruptive (misbehaving). (God) 1 Thessalonians 5:14

This week's missive has both "good" news and "bad" news as they pertain to school attendance. First the "Bad" news. I am constantly amazed each morning as the Kiosk prints out Tardy Passes for students who are late to school. Apparently, punctuality is no longer a word used in "real life" by a large percentage of our school population. This morning we recorded 133 students as being Tardy to school, some by a few minutes, others by as much as an hour or more. That constitutes 15.5% of the school population here at MLHS. I have also been tracking hourly attendance for hours 2-8. Yesterday, there were 103 students who were late to two or more classes during the day. That makes up 12% of the school population. Clearly, we need to make a change in both student and parent culture and perceptions of being "on-time" to work.

Now for the "good" news. Overall school attendance yesterday was 97%. This has been one of our best days this term. So, even though many are late, the majority do manage to eventually attend. Here's a breakdown by grade. The Freshman average daily attendance for the first 10 weeks of school is 95%. The Frosh Rock! The Juniors are in at 94.9%, while the Seniors have dropped to third place with a score of 94.6%. The Sophomores continue to lag each week and have an average of only 94%. That makes our current year-to-date average weekly attendance 94.8 %. Our established goal for the school year is 97%. We still have a way to go as we seek to change our MLHS culture.

School Culture is a way of life for us all here at Milwaukee Lutheran High School. We serve because we are Chosen by God (Colossians 3:12) to be his servants. We glorify God by serving His people through our lives of Christian Culture.
