Christians, too, are searching Scripture to understand the freedoms that exist as children of the Creator.



As these questions arise, Paul writes these words in his letter to Rome that also should speak to us: Therefore, I urge you, brothers, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as living sacrifices, holy and pleasing to God – this is your spiritual act of worship. Do not conform any longer to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is – his good, pleasing and perfect will. (Ro 12:1-2)

We are called to recognize that God has granted us all we have – including our frame of flesh and blood, but also our hearts and minds. They belong to Him. We willingly offer then back in service to Him. Does that mean that we have complete freedom?

Secondly, we are told to avoid the trappings of this world and the desires of this flesh. Rather we are to be transformed as people of God. This transformation happens by the Holy Spirit as we hear God's Word. Because of the truths that it contains, which often is contrary to this world, we are called to be counter culture. We are told to "test and approve what God's will is." Does that mean that we have complete freedom?

Our freedom as Christians is not based on these perceived infringements on freedom, but rather on what the work of Jesus Christ at Calvary has offered. By His death and resurrection, we have freedom from the eternal effects of sin. By Him, we have victory over death. That is His will for us – that we can live our lives as redeemed individuals – always understanding the debt that was paid on our behalf, but with the chance to express our freedom to live our lives in service to Him. Following God's will does not mean that we have a free license to do whatever we please. It also does not mean that he has a prescribed script for our entire life that we somehow must try and figure out. It means that no matter what happens, he has already provided the final answer by the salvation work of Jesus Christ. Stand Firm on that Truth!

Some Physics Students float their ideas in the MLHS pool...

97 Physics students at Milwaukee Lutheran, under the direction of instructor Mr. Eric Pankow, made 29 building teams to compete in the 12th annual MLHS Cardboard Boat Contest. Hundreds of parents and friends showed up on Wednesday, November 8th to watch the students put their knowledge and bodies into the study of Archimedes Principle. The boats were made of cardboard, with duct tape allowed to support the seams or to decorate the boats. The students put their understanding of Archimedes' Principle to the test by getting into the boats they designed and paddling them across the Milwaukee Lutheran pool. Extra credit was given if more than one person got into the boat or if they "dressed up" with a theme. Of the 29 boats, 16 made it across the pool without sinking. The winning boat this year was the 1 person boat made by Juniors Tim Steinke and Xavier Fisher, paddled by Tim. Their cardboard Kayak themed "Formula One" set a new school and single paddler record of 13.6 seconds. Other Thematic boats included Sponge Bob, Star Wars, Moana, Mean Girls, Mario Kart, Pirates, Planet of the Apes, Mickey and Minnie Mouse, and many more. Special thanks to Mr. and Mrs. Koebert, Miss Bolz, Mr. Saugstad, Miss. Siebarth, and Miss Pfenning, the Maintenance Department, and the Administration for supporting this exciting use of our learning! If you want to watch the races, they are posted on You Tube under "2017 Milwaukee Lutheran Cardboard Boat Race" (the school record is set in the 3rd race).
