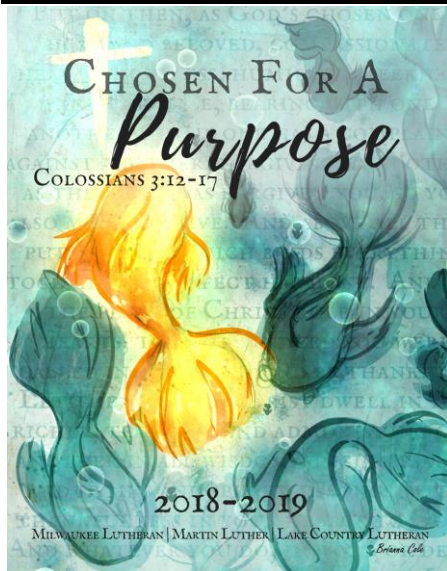

You've all heard the story of Robin Hood and his band of Merry Men, who stole from the rich to give to the poor. Giving to the poor is a good thing; stealing it first—not so good. We bomb during war, killing many, but saving others—good, right? We sponsor drug trials that allow some to die anyway, while searching for a cure that may potentially save thousands—good, right? “The end justifies the means,” is a misquote from Machiavelli who used other's gold to buy his safety.

In Romans 3:23-24 we read, “All have sinned and fallen short of the glory of God and are justified by His grace as a gift through the redemption that is in Jesus Christ.” When God justifies, He completely removes sin—all is forgotten as it is forgiven. God looks at my heart and sees me just as if I'd never sinned. That's what justified means.

What's the connection here you might ask? In Hebrews 12 we read, “look to Jesus the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, scorning its shame...” It was right there. You saw the connection, right? The JOY that was set before Him is the end. We are His JOY. He endured the cross is the means to that end. Wow! God who created us and loves us, wanted to save us so much that he sacrificed His only son in our place. The end (salvation) justified the means (the cross). Maybe a more correct analogy would be this. The means—Jesus Christ—Justifies the end—eternal life. We are viewed by our Heavenly Father just as if we'd never sinned. Wow!

What does God expect of us now? Nothing! Each of us is simply the JOY that was set before Jesus as He was beaten, nailed to the cross, reviled, stabbed, and executed. To my way of thinking—old and sore as I am today—I am (we are) the means to God's end. We have the JOY of teenagers set before us each day, enduring whatever the day may bring; that the Holy Spirit may call, gather, and enlighten the spark of Jesus' light that was planted in a student's heart today.

“Not with gold or silver, but with His holy precious blood and His innocent suffering and death.” The means. Just as if I'd never sinned, “that I may be His own and live in His kingdom and serve Him in life everlasting.” The end.
