FROM THE PRINCIPAL . . .

Hold One Another Accountable

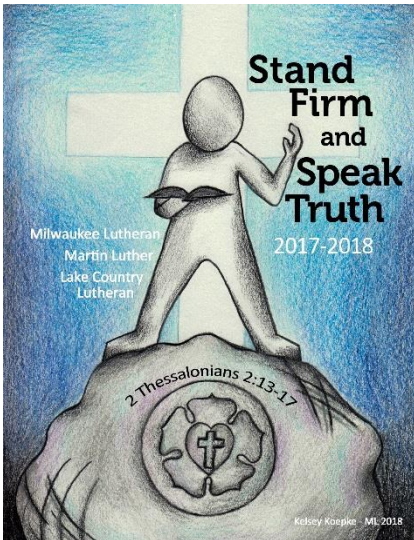
As I read or watch the news lately, one clear issue that emerges is the idea of accountability. Many current stories have an underlying theme of the lack of or need for accountability. This is a major feature of cultures that enables things to run effectively and without chaos. All groups and individuals need accountability as a signature feature of peaceful existence.

As Christians, our accountability is revealed in the Commandments given to Moses and to all the people of God. Unfortunately, because of our sinful nature we fall into the temptations of the flesh. Our thoughts, motives, and behaviors lie outside of God's design for the relationship we have with Him and with each other. It is because we are unable to live along these lines that accountability is necessary.

Christ outlines the expectations for how we are to resolve conflict within the Church. We are instructed to reveal the sin in a fellow Christians life to them. It is our responsibility as a part of our Christian community. When we have wronged, hurt, or harmed another (even if it was unintentional) we are too resolve the issue by following these guidelines.

If your brother sins against you, go and tell him his fault, between you and him alone. If he listens to you, you have gained your brother. But if he does not listen, take one or two others along with you, that every charge may be established by the evidence of two or three witnesses. If he refuses to listen to them, tell it to the church. And if he refuses to listen even to the church, let him be to you as a Gentile and a tax collector. (Matthew 18:15-17)

This accountability is needed so that we can live at peace with one another. "Make every effort to live in peace with all men and to be holy; without holiness no one will see the Lord – Hebrews 12:14." As we both look to hold individuals accountable, we are called to reconcile relationships with each other. Rather than displaying apathy or turning toward resentment, we are called to restore the relationships between us just as Christ has reconciled us to himself by the sacrifice of the Cross (2 Corinthians 5:16-21). May we be compassionate enough to communicate with our neighbor of the concerns we have for their spiritual walk. It demonstrates another opportunity to Stand Firm and Speak Truth.

ACT Testing for All Juniors

The State of Wisconsin requires high schools to administer ACT testing to all juniors each spring. The ACT Plus Writing will be given on Tuesday, February 27. The ACT Work Keys assessment will be given on Wednesday, February 28, 2017. All juniors are required to be in attendance and will report directly to the gymnasium at 7:50 AM. Transition students will report to the Red Knight Room (across from the cafeteria) at 7:50 AM.

A few notes on ACT testing:

- Your child is already registered for these exams - no further paperwork is needed
- ACT and ACT WorkKeys are completely free - there is no registration fee
- ACT is a national standardized test required by most colleges and universities for admission and scholarship opportunities
- You do NOT need to report these scores to colleges and universities, but it is your right to do so if you prefer
- ACT WorkKeys is an exam which measures career readiness
- Accommodations have already been filed and approved for all Transition students

18-19 School Year CHOICE Programs – Application Process begins soon!

This is a reminder to all our current families that our first MPCP Open Enrollment Period begins February 1, 2018 and ends February 20, 2018 (WPCP is February 1, 2018 - April 20, 2018), however, you cannot start that online application until February 1st. The online application process remains the same as last year and you will be able to log in, starting Feb. 1, at the following link with the email and password that you used last year:

EVERY CURRENT CHOICE STUDENT MUST RE-APPLY EVERY YEAR!

For possible **NEW** families to the CHOICE programs - if you think that you may qualify for the CHOICE program this year, go to the above link and click on **18-19 Income Limits** to see if you qualify - **income limits have increased from the previous school year.**

It is STRONGLY recommended that you apply for CHOICE during the February open enrollment period, as all our MPCP seats will be filled during that month, and you will be on a wait list if you apply after February – we can NOT guarantee your student a CHOICE seat at Milwaukee Lutheran if you apply during a later open enrollment period!

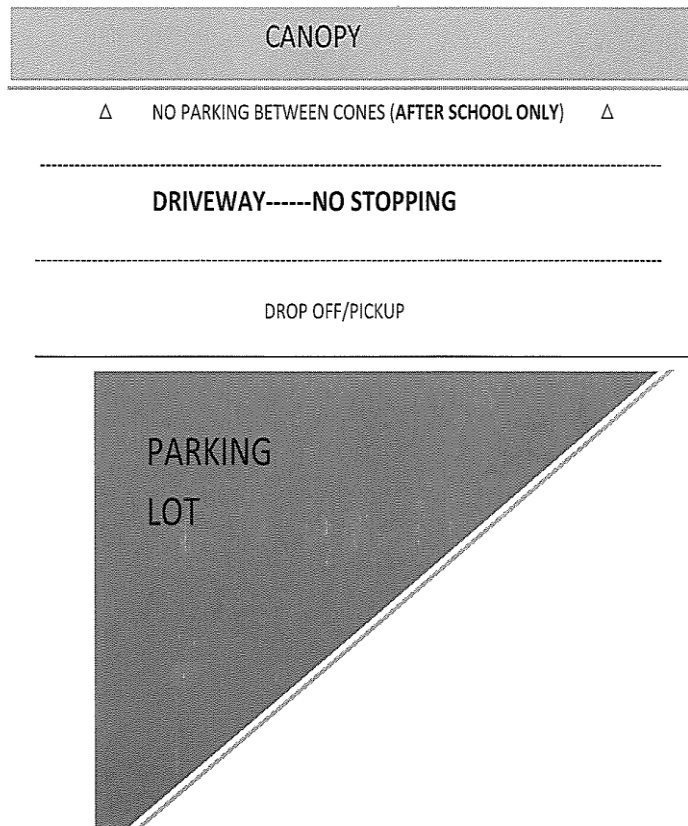
