God has chosen you to LIVE IN PEACE


Repay no one evil for evil, but give thought to do what is honorable in the sight of all. If possible, so far as it depends on you, live peaceably with all. (Romans 12:17-18)

Adam Kirsch These verses fall into a section of Paul's letter to the Romans where he is focusing on love. He specifically calls us to love in the way that Christ loves us. The challenging part of this Scripture is that we are called to demonstrate love to those that can be hard to love. In other parts of Scripture, we are told to love our enemies. Even when we disagree with someone, we are called to live at peace with them.

Doesn't this seem at odds with the concept that we hold up Truth? How do we reconcile our responsibility to hold each other accountable with the charge of keeping the peace?

This issue continues to remain at the forefront of our culture. This verse compels us to hold each our accountable – in love. I recognize that there are very different perspectives that form our worldview, yet as Christians we are called to love and to live at peace. Issues of peace constantly come across our headlines. Our world is more interested in creating conflict – even if it has to be artificially manufactured. We try to create issues where there may be none with the intent of seeing others suffer. We are often drawn to conflict with a perverse interest rather than appreciating peace.

And this is where we, as Christians, must be set apart in how we live and in how we interact. This is why we have been Chosen. We are instructed to never intentionally create hostility. We are called to live at peace with those around us. We are called to demonstrate love – even when it is difficult. May we experience and live in peace.

10 MINUTE RULE

Due to the excessive number of school tardies, even on late start Thursdays, we have instituted a new morning procedure. Students who arrive after 8:00 AM will no longer be given passes to their first hour classes. They will instead be sent to a holding room for the hour. Repeat offenders will be given detentions and writing assignments to complete. We cannot continue to allow the classes and instruction to be interrupted by late students. We ask that you make an extra effort to have your students arrive before 7:45 AM.

SAFE and SECURE

Let's face it, the world today can be a dangerous place. We lock our doors, we walk through metal detectors, we place security devices on our phones and guard our identities. We put a lot of faith in the all-seeing security cameras mounted on buildings, streets, and even in many of our homes. But those cameras that offer us home protection wouldn't exist without the efforts of African-American inventor, Marie Van Brittan Brown, who invented the first home security system.

As a nurse living in Jamaica, Queens, New York, Brown's schedule often left her home alone at a time when the crime rate in her neighborhood was steadily increasing. Frustrated by slow police response times and a lack of interest on behalf of the local politicians, in 1966 she invented a sophisticated video and audio system with help from her electrician husband, Albert. The couple received a patent in 1969 for this first of a kind system. Their invention laid the foundation for all future home security systems and was soon in demand for use in apartment buildings and businesses. Their original patent is now the basis for 13 major home security systems that use some aspect of their closed-circuit or remote-control model.

We can employ all sorts of security devices to keep us safe in our daily journey, but our real home is with our Savior Jesus in heaven. Proverbs 14:26 puts it this way, "He who fears the Lord has a secure fortress;" and in Proverbs 28:26 we read, "He who trusts in himself is a fool, but he who walks in the wisdom and trusts in the Lord is kept safe." While great inventions have, and will continue to make us feel safe on the street and in our homes; it is God, who, through the Holy Spirit, guards our souls for eternal life with Him. Although our earthly safety and security are important to us, it is the security of our souls that takes precedent. In Baptism we were washed with the sign of the cross to remind us that "JUST AS CHRIST WAS RAISED FROM THE DEAD BY THE GLORY OF THE FATHER, WE TOO MAY — SECURELY—LIVE A NEW LIFE, IN RIGHTEOUSNESS AND PURITY FOREVER."

Through the blood of Jesus Christ we have the hope and security of eternal life. This is our Christian culture here at Milwaukee Lutheran High School.


