God has chosen you to LIVE IN PEACE


Repay no one evil for evil, but give thought to do what is honorable in the sight of all. If possible, so far as it depends on you, live peaceably with all. (Romans 12:17-18)

Adam Kirsch These verses fall into a section of Paul's letter to the Romans where he is focusing on love. He specifically calls us to love in the way that Christ loves us. The challenging part of this Scripture is that we are called to demonstrate love to those that can be hard to love. In other parts of Scripture, we are told to love our enemies. Even when we disagree with someone, we are called to live at peace with them.

Doesn't this seem at odds with the concept that we hold up Truth? How do we reconcile our responsibility to hold each other accountable with the charge of keeping the peace?

This issue continues to remain at the forefront of our culture. This verse compels us to hold each our accountable – in love. I recognize that there are very different perspectives that form our worldview, yet as Christians we are called to love and to live at peace. Issues of peace constantly come across our headlines. Our world is more interested in creating conflict – even if it has to be artificially manufactured. We try to create issues where there may be none with the intent of seeing others suffer. We are often drawn to conflict with a perverse interest rather than appreciating peace.

And this is where we, as Christians, must be set apart in how we live and in how we interact. This is why we have been Chosen. We are instructed to never intentionally create hostility. We are called to live at peace with those around us. We are called to demonstrate love – even when it is difficult. May we experience and live in peace.

SCHOOL CALENDAR CHANGES

With the cancellation of school days due to extreme weather, we have found ourselves with the need to make-up additional hours. We already added back in a day on February 22nd. In order to meet our required time (assuming no further cancellations are needed in the future weeks) we will be adding back in a day of school and eliminating our Thursday late starts.

<u>Friday, March 15, will be a ½ day of school</u> with an early dismissal at 12:20 pm. The Parent/Teacher conferences originally scheduled for Friday morning have been cancelled.

Parent/Teacher Conferences will take place <u>only</u> on Thursday, March 14, from 5:00 - 7:30 pm. We ask that you keep your conferences brief. If you know your conference needs require more time, please contact your student's teacher(s) earlier in the week <u>before</u> Thursday, March 14.

Beginning on Thurs., March 4th, all Thurs. mornings will start at 7:50 am rather than the late start time of 8:30 am.

We appreciate your understanding and flexibility as we work out the best options to make sure that we meet our requirements and serve our students.

ATTENDANCE PROCEDURES . . .

Absences must be reported to the Attendance Office at (414) 461-6062 or attendance@milwaukeelutheran.org by a parent/guardian prior to 9am on the day of the absence. A written excuse must also be submitted to the Attendance Office on the day the student returns to school.

SNOW DAYS In the event severe weather conditions would occur, please check one of the local media outlets for

information on school closings. Our recommendation is that you check the WTMJ website (www.todaystmj4.com) for the earliest and most up-to-date information. Other media outlets broadcasting school closings include:

Since our students come from many parts of the metropolitan area, weather conditions may vary from one area to another. Please use discretion in sending your child to school even though school may be in session. A guideline to use in making your decision would be the decision that your local public school district has made. (Example: If you live in Cedarburg and the Cedarburg school district has closed due to the weather, consider keeping your child home from school that day.)

In the event that a sudden snowstorm forces school to close before the regular closing time, make certain that your child knows exactly where to go and what to do should no one be home during the school day.



<u>Congratulations To Junior Wrestler Olurotimi (Timi) Ladeinde</u> <u>First State qualifier in 16 years!</u>



Timi started the season as a backup 285-pound wrestler. After our starter was injured in the first tournament, Timi stepped in. He had a solid tournament at West Allis Central, where eight of the 16 wrestlers were state qualifiers. He followed it up with a medal finish at the 40+ Mid-States Tournament. Timi continued to wrestle strong throughout the season.

When our starting senior wrestler came back, he and Timi battled for the starting position, with Timi getting the edge for the WIAA State Tournament series. Timi showed that hard work and dedication pays off. Timi finished second at Regionals, and then became just the third Sectional Champion in Milwaukee Lutheran history, and the first since Ryan Dummann and Courtney Clark-Carter each won it in 2003.

At the state tournament, Timi was nervous, but got his first takedown with ease in his first match. After his opponent from Oshkosh West earned an escape Timi countered a throw and put his opponent to his back, earning a first-period pin and a win at the state tournament! Timi

lost his next two matches (6-2 in the quarterfinals; 5-1 in the consolations) but had an extremely successful junior campaign and state tournament experience.

Coach Meulendyke said, "Timi has turned himself into an extremely dedicated worker in the weight room and is looking to do some off-season wrestling this year. His attitude and work have turned him into an athlete that loves wrestling with the potential to lead his team into some great successes next year, while also putting himself in position to be an all-state wrestler himself."

Great job Timi! Milwaukee Lutheran, the staff, your teammates and coaches are all proud of your accomplishments this year!
