### FROM THE PRINCIPAL . . .

God has chosen you to FORGIVE


There may be no harder concept to put into practice in our lives as Christians than to display forgiveness. The reality is that, because of sin, we will hurt and harm each other – sometimes unintentionally. And also because of sin, we become pretty adept at holding grudges when we have been hurt or wronged. We clutch onto the pain and refuse to move on often because we don't believe the other person deserves to be forgiven or because our hurt is too deep.

This was probably the motive behind Peter's question to Jesus in Matthew 18:21-22. "Then Peter came to Jesus and asked, "Lord, how many times shall I forgive my brother when he sins against me? Up to seven times?"

Jesus answered, "I tell you, not seven times, but seventy-seven times.""

Jesus's response shows that we are called to forgive each other. Not based off a specific numeric formula, but with the mercy that we have been shown. Jesus Christ came to earth to forgive each of us. It is completely undeserved. He doesn't treat us as we deserve to be treated and we don't have to endure the spiritual effects of our sins, but instead He offers us complete forgiveness (see Psalm 103:8-12). And He calls us to do likewise. He has chosen us to do likewise.

### 10 MINUTE RULE

### What's Your Idol?

"You shall worship the Lord your God, and Him only shall you serve!" Luke 4:8

In the face of calamity, what one object or tool would you try the hardest to save? Might it be food, water, a photo album, your pet, an autographed baseball, a tackle box, an address book, a favorite jacket, or perhaps your cell phone. Whichever item you chose from this list, or from your own list, speaks to your character.

When you hear the world idolatry, I bet you probably think of stories from the Old Testament – the Golden Calf, perhaps – or the commandment "You shall have no other God's before me". As a child, I thought idolatry meant worshiping statues or false gods. As I aged (gracefully!), I realized something: idolatry is a sin that I and so many other Christians struggle with! Anything can be an idol. Anything that we put before God, and before our relationship with Him, is an idol that has displaced God as the priority in our life.

So, can an idol be an object? Yes. It could be your phone or computer. It could be money. Can an idol be a person? Yes! It could be your boyfriend or girlfriend, or maybe someone popular you're trying to impress, or a celebrity you love. An idol can also be something less concrete, like the idea of success or power or popularity. It could be the idea of having a perfect future with a spouse and kids and a pretty house. All these things by themselves are not problematic, but when we let them surpass God as a priority in our lives, that's where the problems begin.

How do you find out if a good thing in your life is turning into an idol? The best test is to examine your decision-making process. Start by looking at your major life decisions. Why do you want to pursue a particular career? Is it because you want to be rich? Maybe money is your idol. If it's because you want to be famous; maybe your ego is an idol. Then, look at the decisions that dictate your everyday life. Did you choose a party over youth group five weeks in a row? Popularity might be an idol. Has playing on your phone pushed out prayer? Your phone might be an idol. Are you dating because you don't want to be alone? Romance and relationships might be an idol.

If you've realized idolatry is a problem for you, don't worry! You're not alone. Many Christians, myself included, have battled idolatry at points. Be assured, it is possible to fight against idolatry and give God back the number one spot in your life. First, pray. Ask God to forgive you for displacing him from your top spot and ask for His help in restoring order. Secondly, take action to remove the idol. In some situations, this may be easy. Turn off your phone during quiet times. Take down all the celebrity posters and spend time with real friends. But in other situations, it might be harder. Letting go of an idea can be challenging. In these situations, turn to God's word and to his people. Remind yourself of His goodness, and the blessings that He alone provides. Remember why God alone deserves to be your top priority. He gave everything for you, so it's only right that you dedicate everything for him.

We should fear, love, and trust in God above all things. God bless your life's journey.

### **GENTLEMEN:**

This is a FORMAL dance and gentleman must wear a tux or suit that follows this dress code:

- 1. You must wear your dress shirt during the entire event.
- You cannot wear your vest/suspenders on their own. You must wear your dress shirt underneath them.
- 3. No hats or canes will be allowed.

### **LADIES:**

This is a FORMAL dance and ladies must wear a dress that follows this dress code:

- 1. A dress: no suits, pants or jumpers.
- 2. One piece no two-piece dresses will be allowed, regardless if midriff is showing or not.
- 3. No midriffs can be showing.
- 4. No cut-outs on the front of the dress (no bare skin should be showing in the middle of the dress).
- 5. Cut-outs on the shoulders and sides will be allowed, as long as they do not exceed 3 inches.
- 6. Slits in dresses should be no higher than 4 inches above the knee.
- 7. No deep V necks or plunging necklines; sheer fabrics do not count as cover up for this area of the dress.
- 8. Dresses that are shorter in style must be no shorter than 4 inches above the knee.
- 9. Shoes must be worn at all time while at the Harley Davidson Museum Garage. If you plan to take off your heels, please bring a pair of sandals/flats to wear the rest of the evening.

\*\*\*Failure to comply with this dress code will result in your dismissal from the dance without a refund. MLHS will not make exceptions at the dance for wardrobe issues (we will not supply t-shirts, safety pins, etc.). 
