

God's Truth is Not Always Popular


One of the largest traps of life, regardless of age, is chasing what is popular. Fads change and trends die. The individual who was popular falls out of that role – sometimes for no reason. The pursuit of popularity typically results in disappointment. We see it often among the students that we work with here at school. High school is often the point at which an individual begins to discover their identity and where they "fit". Unfortunately, often students attempt to change who they are to fit in with a group that seems more socially acceptable. At some point, there is the realization that they were created for something else. The quicker individuals can move to that point the better for their continued development.

The reality is that Christianity is rarely popular – as has been the case for most of history. The world and our sinful nature would suggest that individuals be free to make whatever decisions are best for them. But our Christian faith calls us to something different – and often that directly contradicts what is popular. The Truth is often painful to hear. The Truth of Scripture is that we are to avoid those world things and instead focus on the fruit of a relationship with our Heavenly Father first. To be fair, not everything that is popular is the desire of the flesh, but unfortunately it is much easier to pursue these worldly things than allowing ourselves to be pursued by our Creator.

Sometimes this means that we will stand out from the rest of the world. We may be isolated because we refuse to conform to the world (this was our chapel message on Wednesday of this last week). We are not called to be popular, but to be faithful. As we face the possible rejection or insults because of our beliefs we are reminded to Stand Firm.

Beloved, do not be surprised at the fiery trial when it comes upon you to test you, as though something strange were happening to you. But rejoice insofar as you share Christ's sufferings, that you may also rejoice and be glad when his glory is revealed. If you are insulted for the name of Christ, you are blessed, because the Spirit of glory and of God rests upon you. (1 Peter 4:12-14)

May we live with the promise that, even if we are unpopular here on earth for worshipping the Risen Christ, we will one day reap His glory. Stand Firm on that Truth!



Photo of Dr. Chris Wilson after he awarded the Red Knight Boys Team the plaque for winning the 9 team Chris Wilson Invite (20th annual) on Saturday, March 24th. The meet is named after Dr. Wilson, one of 2 former Milwaukee Lutheran athletes in the Wisconsin Track and Field Coaches Hall of Fame. The Red Knight Boys dominated the meet, winning 9 of the 13 events and scoring 183 team points to 2nd place Port Washington's 86 points. The girls finished a close 2nd to Port Washington (127-115), winning 5 of the 13 events.
