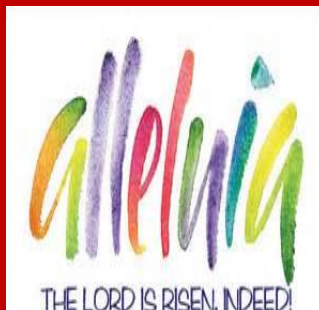

FROM THE PRINCIPAL . . .

Be Bold in Your Faith

Humble and bold – seemingly two contradictory characteristics of the Christian life. We receive instruction in Scripture to be both:

All of you, clothe yourselves with humility toward one another, because, God opposes the proud but gives grace to the humble. Humble yourselves, therefore, under God's mighty hand, that he may lift you up in due time. – 1 Peter 5:5-6

And if what was fading away came with glory, how much greater is the glory of that which lasts!

Therefore, since we have such a hope, we are very bold. – 2 Corinthians 3:11-12

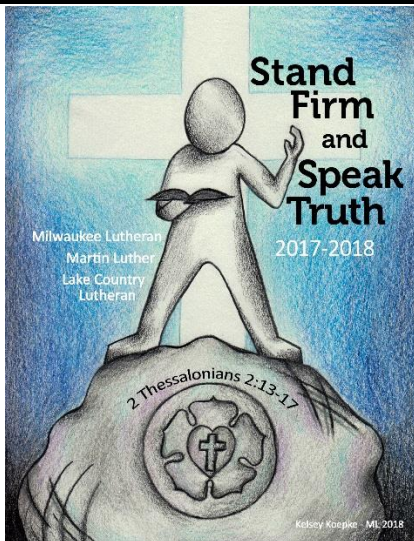
How do we reconcile the tension that seems to exist between these two attributes?

Our humility is founded on the simple fact that we are unable to do anything on our own. We are completely reliant on a higher power. Certainly, many people wrongly believe that they are completely self-sufficient – that they can control their lives. The reality is that, while we make decisions every day (some of which we regret later on), our lives are all part of our Heavenly Father's orchestration of this world. Because of our sin, which we are unable to prevent and rectify, we are completely dependent on our Savior for His mercy and grace.

The mercy and grace of Jesus Christ toward all people was demonstrated throughout His earthly life. In complete humility, our God took on flesh and came to live among the sinners of this world. He experienced the earthly trials, temptations, and struggles – yet never yielded to them. He endured the pain and agony of death. He certainly demonstrated humility. However, in His resurrection he also boldly and confidently conquered death and the devil. He exemplifies how to demonstrate both of these attributes.

After the resurrection, Christ's closest friends received the Spirit upon their lives which enabled them to boldly proclaim their faith. Because of the resurrection, we too are called to be bold in our faith. A boldness based on the foundation of Christ rather than our own actions. A boldness to share the message of the Risen Lord in words and in actions. We are not called to be timid or shy away from the one thing that provides us hope, but to Stand Firm on His promises in confidence.

I am not ashamed of the gospel, because it is the power of God for the salvation of everyone who believes: first for the Jew, then for the Gentile. For in the gospel a righteousness from God is revealed, a righteousness that is by faith from first to last, just as it is written: "The righteous will live by faith." – Romans 1:16-17
