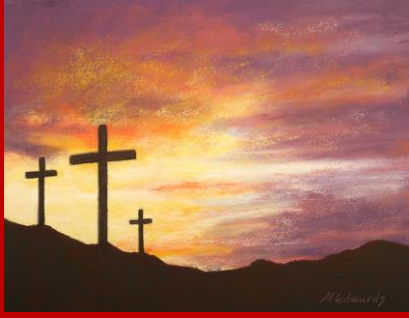

FROM THE PRINCIPAL . . . **God has chosen you to BE PATIENT**

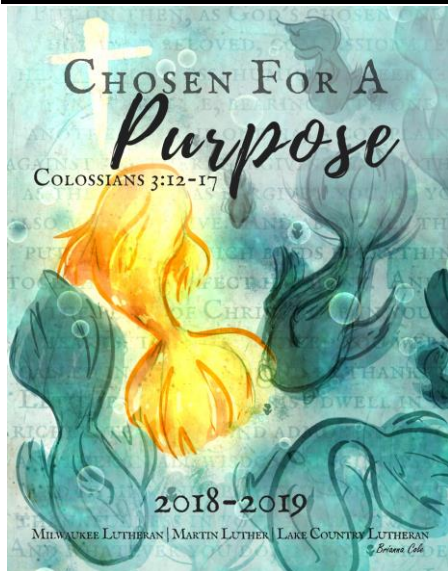
“Patience is a virtue”. In our faculty Bible study a few weeks ago, we talked about the concept of Christian virtues. One of the main differentiators in our discussion was that virtues tend to remain the same because of their foundation rather than values which tend to shift based on culture or popular opinion.

We can certainly be challenged in our patience. Much has been written about our instant and personalized world. We celebrate how many products and programs are designed to serve us specifically without us having to invest time or effort. They make our life easier, but it creates a level of impatience with anything that requires we wait. We have gotten to the point where all our desires are expected to be met immediately.

But reality can strike us when we realize that some things in life require that we slow down and allow things to develop over time. That is certainly the case with our Spiritual walk. The Lord sometimes challenges us by telling us that our requests or our desires need to be put on hold. When this happens, we have the tendency to get very impatient with God. But God knows what we need for our good. He understands the timing that will best accomplish His purposes. His wisdom shows us that we may just need to wait – and be patient – even if it is painful.

*Commit your way to the Lord; trust in him and he will do this:
He will make your righteousness shine like the dawn, the justice of your cause like the noontday sun. Be still before the Lord and wait patiently for him; do not fret when men succeed in their ways, when they carry out their wicked schemes. Psalms 37:5-7*

Due to the excessive number of school tardies, even on late start Thursdays, we have instituted a new morning procedure. We Are Easter People

“He is Risen!” “He is Risen Indeed! Alleluia!” This intonation marks the beginning of Lutheran worship services during this season of Easter. It helps to affirm for us that we are indeed Easter People. “What exactly does that mean?” you might ask. It means simply this, that we as Christians believe, teach, and confess that “Jesus Christ (true man) was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended into hell (Where He proclaimed His victory). The third day He (true man) ROSE FROM THE DEAD.” This Resurrection restores for us the sinless image of God into which mankind was created. He atoned for our sins and we, therefore, are justified before God. We will not face eternal death, but rather will be raised to eternal life. “Christ Jesus was delivered over to death for our sins and was raised to life for our justification.” Ro 4:25.

Easter people? How are we different than other people? How does my life show that I am an Easter person? First of all, Easter people believe in Jesus’ resurrection from the dead “that I/we may be His own;” which means we are now righteous and blameless in the sight of God. Secondly, we “live under Him in His kingdom;” that is, we are freed from the slavery of sin and free to serve our God.

Finally, the most observable difference is in how I/we live to, “serve Him in everlasting righteousness, innocence, and blessedness.” This means that I honor God with my whole life and rejoice in Him now on earth and forever in heaven. My words and actions glorify God! I live to honor the Son of God who loves me and gave His life for me. I am an Easter person!

“He is Risen!” “He is Risen Indeed! Alleluia!” Amen.

PROM DRESS CODE: Our dress code reflects Christian modesty. Please respect our dress code as you shop for prom attire.

GENTLEMEN:

This is a FORMAL dance and gentleman must wear a tux or suit that follows this dress code:

1. You must wear your dress shirt during the entire event.
2. You cannot wear your vest/suspenders on their own. You must wear your dress shirt underneath them.
3. No hats or canes will be allowed

LADIES:

This is a FORMAL dance and ladies must wear a dress that follows this dress code:

1. A dress: no suits, pants or jumpers.
2. One piece – no two-piece dresses will be allowed, regardless if midriff is showing or not.
3. No midriffs can be showing.
4. No cut-outs on the front of the dress (no bare skin should be showing in the middle of the dress).
5. Cut-outs on the shoulders and sides will be allowed, as long as they do not exceed 3 inches.
6. Slits in dresses should be no higher than 4 inches above the knee.
7. No deep V necks or plunging necklines; sheer fabrics do not count as cover up for this area of the dress.
8. Dresses that are shorter in style must be no shorter than 4 inches above the knee.
9. Shoes must be worn at all time while at the Harley Davidson Museum Garage. If you plan to take off your heels, please bring a pair of sandals/flats to wear the rest of the evening.

*****Failure to comply with this dress code will result in your dismissal from the dance without a refund. MLHS will not make exceptions at the dance for wardrobe issues (we will not supply t-shirts, safety pins, etc.).
