

ATTENDANCE PROCEDURES . . .

Absences must be reported to the Attendance Office at (414) 461-6062 or <u>attendance@milwaukeelutheran.org</u> by a parent/guardian prior to 9am on the day of the absence. A written excuse must also be submitted to the Attendance Office on the day the student returns to school.

PICKING UP STUDENTS DURING THE SCHOOL DAY:

Students may not leave school without reporting to the Attendance Office. If it is necessary for a student to leave during school hours, a note signed by a parent or a phone call or email at least one hour prior to the student leaving must be presented to the Attendance Office. The student will receive a pass to report back to the Attendance Office at the designated time and be given a Permit to Leave slip. Failure to notify the Attendance Office at least one hour prior to an early pick-up may result in a delayed dismissal.

<u>PARKING LOT SAFETY:</u> For the safety of all our students and parents, please find below a few reminders about dropping off/picking up your student(s) in the morning and after school.
