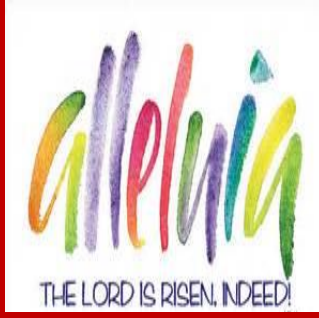

FROM THE PRINCIPAL . . . **God has chosen you to TEACH AND ADMONISH**

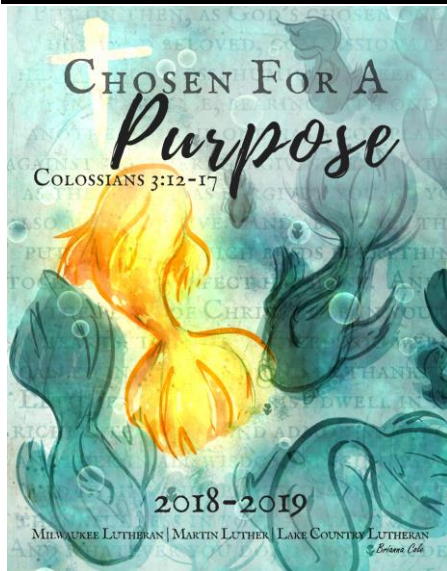
The carrot or the rod? Offer reward or impose a strong will? Both have their merits depending on the situation. These two classic options typically refer to motivating a stubborn animal. But they also can apply to us. I know that teachers are working with students to either encourage, pull, or threaten them in these last few weeks of classes. I know that sometimes teachers have to utilize the same motivational techniques with themselves. I have to admit that there are days where I also must do the same.

But what about our spiritual walk? We have just passed the greatest celebration in the history of mankind as we celebrated Easter. Now we are left with the lingering effects – and possibly even letdown – after such a glorious celebration. It is human nature – the peaks are often followed by the valleys. The joy that we experienced tends to leave us too quickly and we are back to having to discover ways to keep our spiritual life vibrant.

Paul ends his first letter to Thessalonica with these words:

And we urge you, brothers, warn those who are idle, encourage the timid, help the weak, be patient with everyone. 1 Thessalonians 5:14

It is easy for us to become idle, to be laidback, to coast. It is just as easy for us to boil when we see others fall into those traps. But Paul gives instructions for dealing with each other – to motivate others, to encourage one another, to seek out ways to assist one another. I don't believe that this is simply in our physical world, but also applies to our spiritual world. The urgency to share the message of Jesus Christ with those who have not heard, is needed in our culture of spiritual idleness. Christians need to seek ways to encourage those who are spiritually hesitant. We must help those who are struggling in their faith. And most importantly, we must be patient as the Holy Spirit works as he pleases in the lives of us all. We first accomplish this by being in the Word and allowing it to continue to teach and inform us. Ultimately, the Spirit is responsible for all of the faith building that takes place, but we, as Christians, are also called and chosen to be the hands, feet, and mouthpiece for that work. May we continue to seek ways to impact our neighbors as we serve God by teaching and admonishing one another.

1 John 4:10 Herein is love, not that we loved God, but that he loved us, and sent his Son to be the **propitiation** for our sins.

Propitiation means making satisfaction for the demands of God's law. God demanded perfect obedience and perfect payment for sins, which Jesus provided. He became sin and was forsaken by God the Father in our stead. Jesus made complete satisfaction for our sins and tasted our death so that we may now live in eternity. The Blood of the Lamb has freed us from eternal death, just as the Israelites were freed by the lamb's blood on the first Passover night. Jesus was the propitiary sacrifice for our sin. God is Love!

As Easter People we are once again called upon to live our Christian culture. We forgive others because God forgives us.
