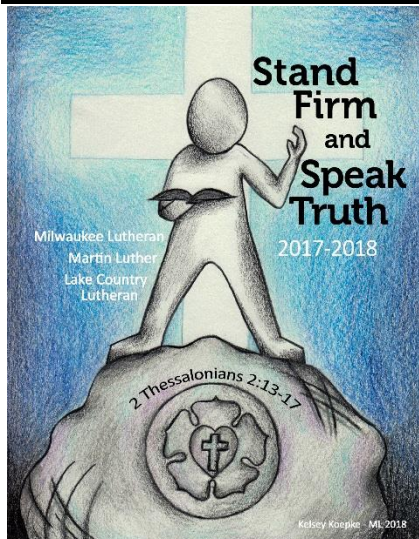

ACADEMIC ADVISING CONTINUED. . .

SUMMER SCHOOL at Milwaukee Lutheran

Students are automatically enrolled in Milwaukee Lutheran's summer school program if they receive a failing grade in Applied English, English 1, and/or Algebra. **There is no fee** to attend this program at Milwaukee Lutheran High School. It is important that students take these courses to improve their skills since they are viewed by many colleges as necessary for admission and so it is in the best interest of students with failing grades to complete this program.

- Summer school English is **Monday through Friday** and begins June 4 and ends June 29 from 7:30 AM until 12:00 PM.
- Summer school Math is **Monday through Thursday** begins June 11 through June 28, breaks for Independence Day week (July 2-6), and finishes July 9-27. Summer school math consists of attending one of two sessions (you only need to attend one session and you will be assigned by the instructor). Math Session 1 is from 10:00-11:30 AM and Session 2 is from 1:00-2:30 PM. If your child is in both summer school English and Math, your child will be assigned to Session 2. If your child is only enrolled in Math, you will be attending session 1.

Photo Preferences:

- ** Head and Shoulders Shot
- ** Your photo **MUST BE** a Vertical image
- ** No Black and White photos
- ** Traditional/Plain Background
- ** JPEG format (at least 300 dpi)

Dress Code Rules:

- ** No Midriff
- ** No Cleavage
- ** Modest Short/Skirt Length
- ** No Hats
- ** No Extreme Hair Color Designs
- ** No Clothing with Offensive Messages
- ** Minimal ripped clothing
- ** Minimal display of tattoos

The 1 image you choose to be included in the yearbook must meet the dress code rules and requirements listed above and can be turned in by emailing the JPEG image to Mrs. Janousky at rjanousky@milwaukeekeelutheran.org or by giving her a CD with your picture choice on it by the October 11 deadline. If you turn in a CD, please make a special note on it if you want it returned.

Please note that if you do not turn in a senior picture to Mrs. Janousky by the October 11 deadline, the yearbook staff will use your MLHS Student ID as your photo in the yearbook.

ATTENDANCE PROCEDURES . . .

Absences must be reported to the Attendance Office at (414) 461-6062 or attendance@milwaukeeelutheran.org by a parent/guardian prior to 9am on the day of the absence. A written excuse must also be submitted to the Attendance Office on the day the student returns to school.

PICKING UP STUDENTS DURING THE SCHOOL DAY:

Students may not leave school without reporting to the Attendance Office. If it is necessary for a student to leave during school hours, a note signed by a parent or a phone call or email at least one hour prior to the student leaving must be presented to the Attendance Office. The student will receive a pass to report back to the Attendance Office at the designated time and be given a Permit to Leave slip. Failure to notify the Attendance Office at least one hour prior to an early pick-up may result in a delayed dismissal.

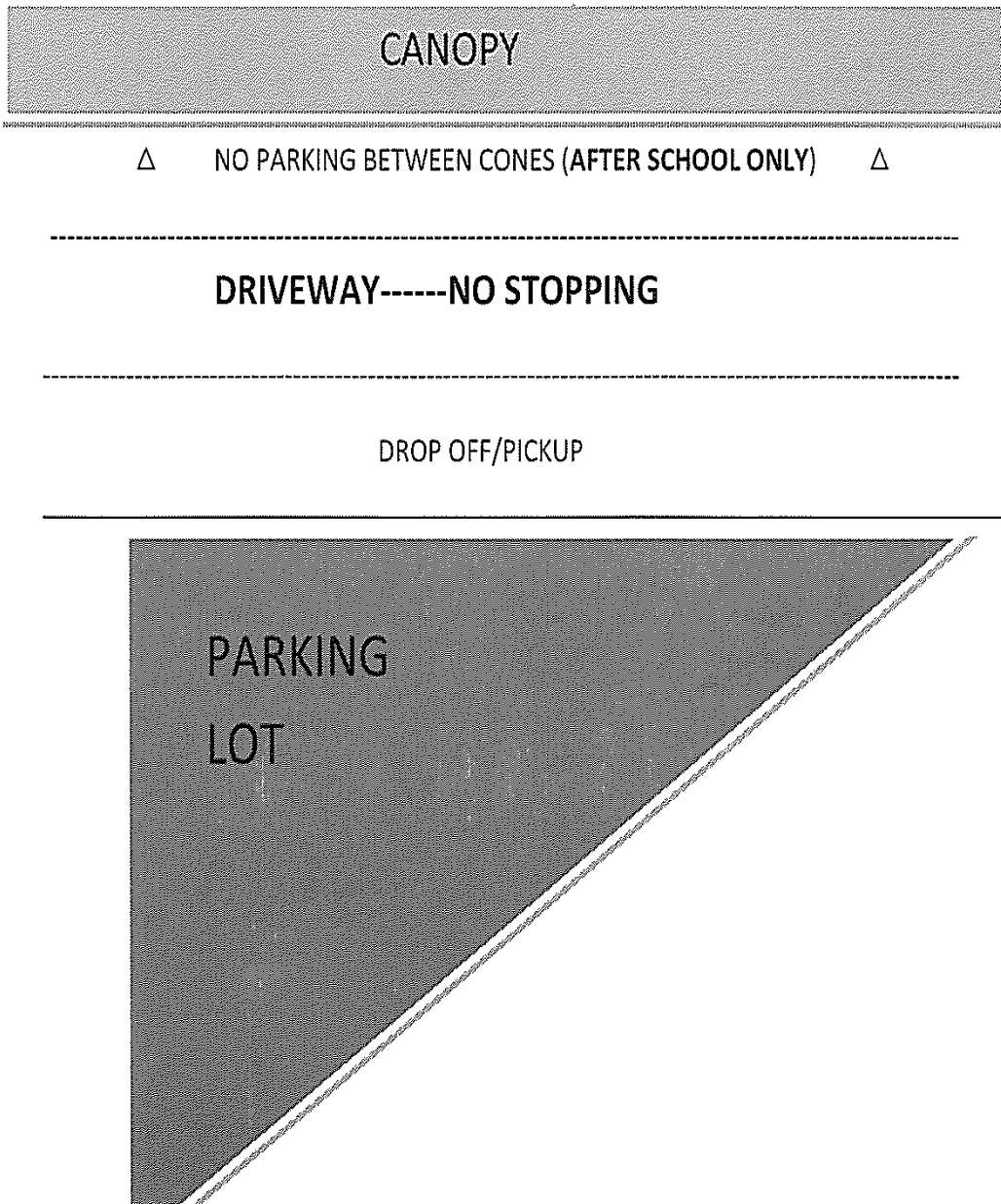
