Love God with all your SOUL by ... praying for His kingdom


First of all, then, I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for all people. 1 Timothy 2:1

Adam Kirsch The first few weeks of the year, we have looked at loving God with all our heart. We now shift our focus onto what God calls us to give of our soul. The verse assigned to these two weeks reminds us of a way that we show love to God and to love others – to pray for His kingdom.

Prayer is one of the most powerful ways that we interact with God – certainly he speaks to us through His Word and comes to us in His body and blood through the Lord's Supper. But in a very real and intimate way, God invites us to speak directly to Him through our prayers. He gives us permission to bring our requests to Him, to cry out in pain or difficulty, and to give Him thanks for the blessings we have. He yearns to hear from us and calls us to pray continuously.

One of the greatest assurances that believers have is God listens to our prayers. He hears us. He acknowledges us. He answers our prayers in the way that is best for us and His kingdom.

We must recognize that sometimes God answers prayers in ways that we don't agree with. His answers may not align with the future that we believe is laid out before us. This means that when we pray, we are ultimately praying for His kingdom plan to be fulfilled. "Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven." We relinquish control and express complete trust in God with our soul when we understand that God will hear and act in accordance with what is best for His kingdom. We sometimes must sacrifice what we think is best in order to understand that God always acts in love in ways that He knows is best.

As Christians we are called to live for our Lord, Jesus Christ. In simple terms that means we integrate our faith into every aspect of our lives. "Go and make disciples of every nation," is our God-given commission. (Matt. 28:19) We believe that we work toward that goal every single day here at MLHS. - 1. Go to this website: www.jostenyearbooks.com
- 2. Choose/type in Milwaukee Lutheran as your school.
- 3. Once you have Milwaukee Lutheran chosen, go to the tab labeled, "2020 Yearbooks."
- **4.** There are several options listed. Please choose the "Yearbook- \$55" option. There is also another option to add the "Signature Package". This is an extra cost but it includes: personalization, color autograph section, and colored markers for signing.
- 5. Add either option to your cart and follow the prompts to complete your order and proceed to checkout. You can add personalization & ICONS as well. Discounted price ends September 13th and includes 4 free icons if you choose to add personalization.
- 6. You can choose to spread out your payments for the yearbook. You will be able to make 3 equal payments over 3 months to help make the book more affordable if you choose to do so.
