God has chosen you to PRAISE GOD



These words of David are part of a Psalm of Thanksgiving. David had just become king. He had conquered Jerusalem and re-established it as the capitol. He had recovered the Ark of the Covenant. He had defeated his enemies. He had much to be thankful for.

We, too, have much to be thankful for. There is much to offer up as praise to our God. He has given us life in His creation. We have been given an identity – not just an earthly appearance, but a spiritual identity as a loved Child of God. He has given us purpose in His mission. That alone gives us plenty of praise-worthy material. But most importantly, He has given us life and hope of a future through the sacrifice of Jesus Christ.
