



## URBAN EDUCATION COMPONENTS

### Urban Education Seminar

Students will participate in the seminar program which helps them develop as a future educational leader, conduct the college search process, improve their standardized test scores, complete scholarship applications with outside organizations, and complete additional book reading on teaching perspectives.

### Education Leadership Lecture Series

Successful urban educators are invited to address students sharing their experiences in the classroom and leadership. These individuals will help junior and senior Academy students hear the challenges, opportunities, and benefits of a teaching career.

### Immersion Experiences

Students will have the opportunity to tour high-performing urban schools and shadow high-performing teachers in Milwaukee through the Center for Urban Teaching (CfUT). Students may also participate as teacher assistants through the CfUT summer school program.

### University Connections

Students will apply for admissions with our Lutheran university partners. Students must meet the admissions standards set forth by the University. Our partners will help students, especially students of color, by providing substantial financial aid to assist with post-secondary costs. Students must complete the FAFSA in order to be granted the Urban Education Academy scholarships.

### Post-Secondary Support

Students will have regular contact with the Urban Education Advisor from Milwaukee Lutheran as they attend college. This discussion will range from updates on academic performance to contact with a student's college advisor. Upon graduation, advisors will help facilitate interviews at high-performing urban schools in Milwaukee.
