Season Recap We began applying our last applica-

tion of the year on October 19th, and we anticipate finishing within a five week window. We will continue to spot spray surviving broadleaf weeds as long as temperatures allow.

Once again, we had a reasonably moderate year for turf, with more than adequate moisture. There were few episodes of high temperatures and high humidity. Fungal outbreaks were, for the most part, minimal in both number and severity; however, we did see some rust late in the season.

Our biggest surprise was some late season grub damage, most of which was discovered only because of the foraging of raccoons and possums. As predicted, healthy, treated lawns are able to withstand insect incursions. Our concern is resistance to the chemicals we use to control grub populations. Fortunately, it seems that the amount of moisture we had may have made the soil even more hospitable for grubs in addition to reducing the effectiveness of the grub application. Based on discussions we had with the staff at UNL, we believe that the product we are using is still an effective control product.

With the continuing mild temperatures, turf continues to grow, and continued mowing is important. Keep the blade sharp and the mower high as you finish out the year. Also remember to pick up or mulch leaves on a regular basis. When you stop mowing for the season, don't forget mower, trimmer, and blower maintenance so you will be ready to go next spring.

I've heard of deep root *fertilizing*, but what is deep root *watering*?



fertilizing, such as delivering nutrients directly to the feeder roots (which are responsible for nutrient and water uptake) and aerating the soil by opening up pockets in our heavy clay soil when the liquid is pressure injected into the ground. Our deep root watering

service offers these same benefits, only instead of adding nutrients to the soil during the growing season, we are delivering much needed water to the root zone during the winter months.


During the winter months the root system of a tree is still actively growing and still needs moisture to survive. Even if we have favorable moisture content throughout the summer, winter watering is still an important step in tree care, especially evergreen trees, and it will help deciduous trees ready themselves for spring growth. The roots of the tree go through a dormancy that is independent of the top portion of the tree and is slightly different. While the top portion of the tree enters dormancy during the fall and doesn't break dormancy until spring when weather is favorable, a root system stays in a resting-but-ready to grow state. When the ground temperature warms, the roots will break dormancy and begin to grow, searching out water and small amounts of nutrients.

Winter deep root watering fast facts:

- Watering during the winter is a time and temperature sensitive activity. Trees should be watered once every 20-30 days during extended dry periods without snow cover.
- Watering should only be done when air and soil temperatures are 40 degrees or higher. If watering by hand, the 40 degree temperature needs to be sustained for a longer period of time than if using the pressure injecting method to allow for greater absorption.
- If you are watering by hand, watering mid-day is best so that the soil can absorb the water before it freezes.
