Setting some basic rules will help bring normality and structure to your home office. Here are a few we like:

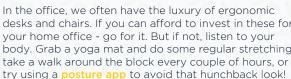
- Schedule coffee breaks away from your computer

- Leave your home office for personal calls

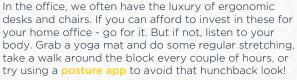


your video calls. There are three things to consider:
