Church Staffing Pain Points (Part 2) Episode 82 5 Issues That Became Clear Over the Last 12 Months of Consulting

Core Staffing Issues (Continued)

3) Not Communicating Effectively

To be clear, this is about ineffective communication within the staff team.

Indicators This Is an Issue on Your Team

- Overuse of email for conversations that should be handled face-to-face.
- Staff frequently feel "surprised" or caught off guard by new information or decisions.
- Communication often feels like it's rolled out in the wrong sequence.
- Decision-making is a challenge: People don't have the information they need or all decisions go to the top because no one knows who makes which calls. (This is a particularly big issue in multisite churches.)

The principle to remember is that effective communication doesn't *just happen*. Leadership must proactively create the systems and culture that evoke the right conversations and get the right information to people at the right times.

Next Steps

- 1. Have the *right* meetings. That doesn't mean adding *more* meetings. It means you create the right ones. The right intersections that bring the right people together.
- 2. Have the right *conclusion* to your meetings.
 - **Summarize what decisions were made at the meeting.** Make sure there's clarity around what was agreed upon and what action needs to be taken (and by when).
 - Second design a communication plan that comes out of the meeting.
