The Process

Step 1: Learn about Blyth-Templeton Academy

Step 3: Supplemental Materials

No standardized entrance testing is required for admission to Blyth-Templeton Academy. We do, however, require the following three supplemental materials:

- Current school official transcript and latest report card
- Math Teacher Recommendation Form
- English Teacher Recommendation Form
- Foreign Language Recommendation Form

These materials must come directly from the school to BTA either by mail to Blyth-Templeton Nashville at 41 Peabody Street Nashville, TN 37210 or by email to BTA.Nashville@gmail.com. After we receive all supplemental materials, you will receive an email confirming your application status. Admissions decisions will be made by the Admissions Committee once all supplemental materials are received and interviews are completed.

Step 4: Schedule and Attend an Interview

The next step is an admissions interview. This one-hour interview is an opportunity for us to explore your academic needs, interests, and goals to determine if Blyth-Templeton Academy will work for you.

- Early Admissions (November 1, 2018)- Early Admissions is the right choice for families excited and confident that BTA is the right fit for their child. Within early admissions, families apply by November 1st and are given an admissions decision by December 1st., 2018. Please see the timeline below.
 - November 1, 2018- application and supplemental materials due
 - Week of November 5th- Interviews Scheduled
 - Week of November 12th- Interviews
 - December 1, 2018- Admission Decision Notification
- Regular Admissions (January 11, 2019)- Regular admissions is for families who are excited about BTA and hope to have more time to explore their school options to ensure we are the right match for their child.
 - January 11, 2019 application and supplemental materials due
 - February- Interviews scheduled
 - March 2, 2019- Admission Decision Notification
- Rolling Admissions- BTA recognizes that Nashville is growing. Because of that- and any other family needs that may arise- BTA reserves limited seats for rolling admissions.
 BTA is committed to being a micro-school and as such has a maximum capacity of forty students per grade level.
