WHAT IS A SMART TV?:

A "smart tv" typically refers to a TV that has Internet capability built into it. In the early days, prior to Roku's, or Amazon Fire Sticks, having a Smart TV was the ONLY way to get the services that are now more readily available via other methods.

Smart TV technology is out-dated, expensive, and frankly, no longer needed. The remote control used to navigate the Internet services is clunky and difficult to use on these TV's. You are MUCH better off using one of the following devices:


ROKU DEVICE:

The Roku is a streaming device that you connect to an HDMI (High Definition Multimedia Interface) port on your television. The Roku device allows you to add channels to your Roku Interface so you can stream movies, tv shows, documentaries, etc to your television for your viewing pleasure. 
AMAZON FIRESTICK



The Amazon Firestick is a streaming device that you connect to an HDMI (High Definition Multimedia Interface) port on your television. This allows you to add channels to your Amazon Firestick so you can stream movies, tv shows, documentaries, etc to your television for your viewing pleasure.
