WHO IS FOOD FOR THE HUNGRY?

- Christ-centered non-profit humanitarian organization seeking to end all forms of human poverty and eliminate physical and spiritual hungers
- Works in over 20 countries in Africa, Latin America, and Asia
- Goes into the hard places and closely walks with the world's most vulnerable people to build transformational relationships, usher justice, and renew communities
- We courageously seek out the overlooked and advocate for the underserved.
- Through community-owned transformation we empower children, families and communities to invest in their own development.

HOW DOES FOOD FOR THE HUNGRY HELP TO END POVERTY?

- Food for the Hungry focuses on children because they're the most vulnerable in any society. When a community is equipped to care for them, everyone is served and poverty is eliminated.
- They focus on four main sectors, which are all applied with the principles of a biblical worldview. They are:
 - Health: Hygiene, nutrition, maternal and newborn care, and disease prevention and treatment
 - Education: Early childhood development, early grade success, ongoing educational opportunities, character building
 - Livelihoods: Agriculture and livestock production, soil and water conservation, market linkages, and microfinance
 - Emergency Response/Disaster Risk Reduction: Community-managed risk assessment and disaster management planning.

WHAT THE MONEY WILL GO TOWARDS?

- Sustainable food sources
- Education for children
