THE POVERTY PROBLEM

- It's not okay that 25,000 children die everyday from hunger related causes
- It's not okay that mother's don't have access to the medical supplies they need to keep their children healthy
- It's not okay that 12-year old girls are forced into marriages because their families can't afford to care for them any longer
- It's not okay that disasters, wars, and social injustices keep people from access to clean water
- It's not okay for us to do nothing.

THE CHURCH'S RESPONSIBILITY TO BE A PART OF THE SOLUTION

• Psalm 146:5-7:

Blessed are those whose help is the God of Jacob, whose hope is in the Lord their God. He is the Maker of heaven and earth, the sea, and everything in them – he remains faithful forever. He upholds the cause of the oppressed and gives food to the hungry.

Matthew 25:40:

The King will reply, Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me.

Isaiah 58:6-10:

Is not this the kind of fasting I have chosen: to loose the chains of injustice and until the cords of the yoke, to set the oppressed free and break every yoke? Is it not to share your food with the hungry and to provide the poor wanderer with shelter – when you see the naked, to clothe them, and not to turn away from your own flesh and blood? Then your light will break forth like the dawn, and your healing will quickly appear; then your righteousness will go before you, and the glory of the Lord will be your rear guard. Then you will call, and the Lord will answer; you will

cry for help, and he will say: Here am I. If you do away with the yoke of oppression, with the pointing finger and malicious talk, and if you spend yourselves in behalf of the hungry and satisfy the needs of the oppressed, then your light will rise in the darkness, and your night will become like the noonday.

HOW DOES FOOD FOR THE HUNGRY HELP TO END POVERTY?

- Food for the Hungry focuses on children because they're the most vulnerable in any society. When a community is equipped to care for them, everyone is served and poverty is eliminated.
- They focus on four main sectors, which are all applied with the principles of a biblical worldview.
 They are:
 - Health: Hygiene, nutrition, maternal and newborn care, and disease prevention and treatment
 - Education: Early childhood development, early grade success, ongoing educational opportunities, character building
 - Livelihoods: Agriculture and livestock production, soil and water conservation, market linkages, and microfinance
 - Emergency Response/Disaster Risk Reduction: Community-managed risk assessment and disaster management planning.

WHAT WILL THE MONEY WILL GO TOWARDS?
