POSITION TITLE: Lead Quality Inspector

POSITION REPORTS TO: Vice President, Manufacturing and Engineering

POSITION SUMMARY: The essential job function is to perform inspection and testing of customer products.

MAJOR RESPONSIBILITIES:

- 1) Perform precision mechanical inspection of machined parts and incoming materials to verify compliance to customer specifications.
- 2) Show strong organizational skills.
- 3) Ensure conformance to customer requirements through the use of calibrated measuring equipment and visual inspection.
- 4) Train and assist others with interpretation of customer drawings/blueprints and specifications.
- 5) Maintain and calibrate measuring and test equipment.
- 6) Inspect incoming purchased parts for compliance to specifications.
- 7) Inspect outgoing material for packaging and conformance to requirements.
- 8) Process nonconforming materials and parts.
- 9) Review routers to ensure that upstream operations have been completed and signed off.
- 10)Complete and file required reports, logs, databases, forms, and documents.
- 11)Follow documented procedures and standards.
- 12)Report safety or process control concerns to the VP Engineering.
- 13)Perform other duties as requested.

- Ability to correctly use and interpret basic measuring tools including weight gauge, micrometer, caliper scale (linear), gauge blocks, thread gauges, and comparative standards
