SVCTE

The program is **FREE** for qualified 11th & 12th grade students who are training for a specific career path. Students who enroll in the program must commit to the **morning** (7:30 a.m. - 9:30 a.m.) or **afternoon** (12:30 p.m. - 3:30 p.m.) session Monday - Friday. Bus transportation is provided from the student's home high school to SVCTE, and back to the home high school.

Our daytime Career Technical Education classes are designed specifically for high school students; adults may register on a spaceavailable basis only.

Of the 20-30 credits earned during the school year, 10 credits (1=1 year for UC) may be reported on a student's application for admission to any University of California or California State University.

Silicon Valley Adult Education (SVAE) offers adult education classes free of charge or at a low cost to adults 18 years or older. SVAE is a comprehensive adult school offering entry-level and advanced courses in health, technology, and careers in the trades. We also offer **free** *English* as a Second Language (ESL), Adult Basic Education (ABE), High School Equivalency (HSE) preparation for GED and HiSET tests, and High School Diploma (HSD) subject courses. We also have a variety of *Career Technical Education* courses and *Online Courses* with affordable registration fees.

We offer free assessment tests to enter ESL, ABE, HSE, and HSD courses, along with academic and career counseling. The *Silicon Valley Regional Testing Center*, located at the Hillsdale main campus, offers state and national tests such as GED, HISET, CBEST, CSET, CPACE, among many others for the convenience of our students and community.

Services to Businesses

Businesses may contract with *Silicon Valley Adult Education* to provide customized computer training and retraining for their employees, English Language Workplace Literacy training, and business operations support services.
